A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 481.151, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivisions (3) and (4) to read as follows:
- 7 (3) "Summary destruction" or "summarily destroy"
- 8 means destruction without the necessity of any court action, a
- 9 <u>court order</u>, or further proceedings.
- 10 <u>(4) "Summary forfeiture" or "summarily forfeit" means</u>
- 11 forfeiture without the necessity of any court action, a court
- order, or further proceedings.
- 13 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 481.152, Health and
- 14 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 481.152. SEIZURE, [AND] SUMMARY FORFEITURE, AND
- 16 SUMMARY DESTRUCTION OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE PLANTS.
- SECTION 3. Section 481.152(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (c) If a person who occupies or controls land or premises on
- 20 which the plants are growing fails on the demand of a peace officer
- 21 to produce an appropriate registration or proof that the person is
- the holder of the registration, the officer may seize and summarily
- 23 forfeit the plants.
- SECTION 4. The heading to Section 481.153, Health and

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- 1 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 481.153. SEIZURE, [AND] SUMMARY FORFEITURE, AND
- 3 SUMMARY DESTRUCTION OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE PROPERTY.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 481.153(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) If an item of controlled substance property is seized
- 7 and forfeited under this section, a court may order the disposition
- 8 of the property under Section 481.159, or the department or a peace
- 9 officer may $\underline{\text{summarily}}$ destroy the property under the rules of the
- 10 department.
- 11 SECTION 6. Section 481.154(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) The director may adopt reasonable rules and procedures,
- 14 not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter, concerning:
- 15 (1) summary forfeiture and <u>summary</u> destruction of
- 16 controlled substance property or plants;
- 17 (2) establishment and operation of a secure storage
- 18 area;
- 19 (3) delegation by a law enforcement agency head of the
- 20 authority to access a secure storage area; and
- 21 (4) minimum tolerance for and the circumstances of
- 22 loss or destruction during an investigation.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
