- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 90.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (11-A) to read as follows:
- 7 (11-A) "MDL panel" means the judicial panel on
- 8 multidistrict litigation designated under Section 74.161,
- 9 Government Code.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 90.010, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 11 Code, is amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection
- 12 (1) to read as follows:
- 13 (c) In an action transferred to an MDL pretrial court in
- 14 which the exposed person is living and has been diagnosed with
- 15 malignant mesothelioma, other malignant asbestos-related cancer,
- 16 malignant silica-related cancer, or acute silicosis, the MDL
- 17 pretrial court shall expedite the action in a manner calculated to
- 18 provide the exposed person with a trial or other disposition in the
- 19 shortest period that is fair to all parties and consistent with the
- 20 principles of due process. The MDL pretrial court should, as far as
- 21 reasonably possible, ensure that such action is brought to trial or
- 22 final disposition within six months from the date the action is
- 23 transferred to the MDL pretrial court, provided that all discovery
- 24 and case management requirements of the MDL pretrial court have

- 1 been satisfied. The MDL panel, at the request of the MDL pretrial
- 2 court, may issue a writ of mandamus to the trial court requiring the
- 3 trial court to set a trial date for the action.
- 4 (1) An MDL pretrial court judge having jurisdiction over
- 5 cases to which this chapter applies shall receive, in addition to
- 6 all other compensation, expenses, and perquisites authorized by
- 7 law, the maximum amount of compensation set by the Texas Judicial
- 8 Council for a presiding judge under Section 74.051(b), Government
- 9 Code. The annual amount must be apportioned over 12 equal monthly
- 10 payments and be paid to the judge by the Texas Judicial Council for
- 11 each month during which the judge retains jurisdiction over the
- 12 cases to which this chapter applies.
- SECTION 3. (a) This Act applies to an action transferred to
- an MDL trial court, as that term is defined by Section 90.001, Civil
- 15 Practice and Remedies Code, without regard to whether the action
- 16 was transferred before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
- 17 (b) The compensation authorized by Section 90.010(1), Civil
- 18 Practice and Remedies Code, as added by this Act, for each month
- 19 that a judge has jurisdiction over cases under Chapter 90, Civil
- 20 Practice and Remedies Code, applies only to a month that begins on
- 21 or after the effective date of this Act.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
