A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2 | relating to the child fatality review process, including the |
| 3 | composition and functions of the child fatality review committee. |
| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Sections 264.502(a), (b), (c), (e), and (h), |
| 6 | Family Code, are amended to read as follows: |
| 7 | (a) The child fatality review team committee is composed of: |
| 8 | (1) a person appointed by and representing the state |
| 9 | registrar [for the bureau] of vital statistics; |
| 10 | (2) a person appointed by and representing the |
| 11 | <u>commissioner</u> [director of protective services for families and |
| 12 | <pre>children] of the department;</pre> |
| 13 | (3) a person appointed by and representing the $\underline{\text{Title V}}$ |
| 14 | director of the [bureau of epidemiology of the Texas] Department of |
| 15 | State Health Services; and |
| 16 | (4) individuals selected under Subsection (b). |
| 17 | (b) The members of the committee who serve under Subsections |
| 18 | (a)(1) through (3) shall select the following additional committee |
| 19 | members: |
| 20 | (1) a criminal prosecutor involved in prosecuting |
| 21 | crimes against children; |
| 22 | (2) a sheriff; |

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(3) a justice of the peace;

(4) a medical examiner;

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- 1 (5) a police chief; 2 a pediatrician experienced in diagnosing and treating child abuse and neglect; 3 4 (7) a child educator; 5 (8) a child mental health provider; 6 a public health professional; (9) 7 a child protective services specialist; (10)8 (11)a sudden infant death syndrome family service provider; 9 10 (12)a neonatologist; a child advocate; 11 (13)a chief juvenile probation officer; [and] 12 (14)a child abuse prevention specialist; 13 (15)14 (16) a representative of the Department of Public 15 Safety; and (17) a representative of the Texas Department of 16 17 Transportation. Members of the committee selected under Subsection (b) 18
- 21 each [even-numbered] year. An appointment to a vacancy on the committee shall be 22 made in the same manner as the original appointment. A member is 23

serve three-year [two-year] terms with the terms of five or six

members, as appropriate, expiring [that expire on] February 1 [of]

24 eligible for reappointment.

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25 (h) A member of the committee is not entitled compensation for serving on the committee but is entitled to 26 reimbursement for the member's travel expenses as provided in the 27

- 1 General Appropriations Act. Reimbursement under this subsection
- 2 for a person serving on the committee under Subsection (a)(2)
- 3 $\left[\frac{(a)(1) \text{ or } (3)}{(3)}\right]$ shall be paid from funds appropriated to the
- 4 <u>department</u> [Texas Department of Health]. Reimbursement for other
- 5 persons serving on the committee shall be paid from funds
- 6 appropriated to the <u>Department of State Health Services</u>
- 7 [department].
- 8 SECTION 2. Sections 264.503(c), (d), and (f), Family Code,
- 9 are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (c) The department shall work cooperatively with:
- 11 (1) the Department of State Health Services [recognize
- 12 the creation and participation of review teams]; [and]
- 13 (2) [work cooperatively with] the committee; and
- 14 (3) [with] individual child fatality review teams.
- 15 (d) The Department of State Health Services shall:
- 16 (1) recognize the creation and participation of review
- 17 teams;
- 18 (2) promote and coordinate training to assist the
- 19 review teams in carrying out their duties;
- 20 $\underline{(3)}$ [$\frac{(2)}{}$] assist the committee in developing model
- 21 protocols for:
- (A) the reporting and investigating of child
- 23 fatalities for law enforcement agencies, child protective
- 24 services, justices of the peace and medical examiners, and other
- 25 professionals involved in the investigations of child deaths;
- 26 (B) the collection of data regarding child
- 27 deaths; and

1 (C) the operation of the review teams;

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- $\underline{(4)}$ [$\underline{(3)}$] develop and implement procedures necessary for the operation of the committee; and
- (5) [(4)] promote education of the public regarding the incidence and causes of child deaths, the public role in preventing child deaths, and specific steps the public can undertake to prevent child deaths.
 - The committee shall issue a report for each preventable The report must include findings related to the child death. child's death, recommendations on how to prevent similar deaths, and details surrounding the department's involvement with the child prior to the child's death. Not later than April [December] 1 of each year, the committee shall publish a compilation of the reports published under this subsection during the year, submit a copy of the compilation to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and department, and make the compilation available to the public. Not later than October [June] 1 of each year, the department shall submit a written response on the compilation from the previous year to the committee, governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives describing which of the committee's recommendations regarding the operation of the child protective services system the department will implement and the methods of implementation.
 - SECTION 3. (a) The child fatality review committee member serving under Section 264.502(a)(3), Family Code, immediately before the effective date of this Act shall continue to serve as a committee member on and after that date until the date a new member

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- 1 is appointed by the Title V director of the Department of State
- 2 Health Services.
- 3 (b) The terms of the members of the child fatality review
- 4 committee appointed under Section 264.502(b), Family Code, and
- 5 serving immediately before the effective date of this Act expire
- 6 February 1, 2008. Not later than February 1, 2008, the committee
- 7 members appointed under Sections 264.502(a)(1) through (3), Family
- 8 Code, as amended by this Act, shall appoint committee members under
- 9 Section 264.502(b), Family Code, as amended by this Act.
- 10 (c) The initial terms of the members appointed under
- 11 Subsection (b) of this section shall be determined by drawing lots
- 12 as follows:
- 13 (1) five members shall serve terms expiring February
- 14 1, 2009;
- 15 (2) six members shall serve terms expiring February 1,
- 16 2010; and
- 17 (3) six members shall serve terms expiring February 1,
- 18 2011.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
