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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of interior designers; providing
3	penalties.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 1051, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1051.3515 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1051.3515. RENEWAL OF INTERIOR DESIGNER CERTIFICATE OF
8	REGISTRATION. To be eligible to renew a certificate of
9	registration, an interior designer who has not passed the
10	examination of the National Council for Interior Design
11	Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the
12	board must:
13	(1) pass section one of that examination or pass a
14	comparable section of an examination of a similar national
15	organization recognized by the board;
16	(2) complete, in addition to the continuing education
17	requirements required for renewal of the certificate of
18	registration under Section 1051.356, 15 hours of board-approved
19	continuing education classes relating to building and barrier-free
20	codes and regulations; or
21	(3) have engaged in the practice of interior design
22	for at least three years under the supervision of an architect or
23	interior designer and passed the examination required for
24	registration as an architect.

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decorative services or assistance in the selection of surface 1 2 materials, window coverings, wall coverings, paint, floor coverings, surface-mounted fixtures, or loose furnishings not 3 subject to regulation under the fire code governing the location 4 where the items will be used, provided that the person does not 5 6 represent that the person is an interior designer; or 7 (3) prevent or restrict a person licensed or 8 registered in this state to engage in a practice or occupation from 9 engaging in that practice or occupation. 10 SECTION 3. Section 1053.151, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 Sec. 1053.151. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. A person other than 12 an interior designer may not: 13 engage in the practice of interior design for 14 (1)15 direct or indirect compensation or offer or attempt to engage in the practice of interior design for direct or indirect compensation; or 16 17 (2) represent that the person is engaged in the practice of interior design or, unless all interior design services 18 provided by the person are rendered or supervised by a person 19 registered under this chapter, represent: 20 21 (A) that the person is an "interior designer" by using any form of that title or of the term "Registered Interior 22 Designer"; or 23 24 (B) [(2) represent,] by using the term "interior 25 design," a service the person offers or performs. SECTION 4. Section 1053.152(b), Occupations Code, 26 is amended to read as follows: 27

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1	(b) To be eligible for a certificate of registration, an
2	applicant must:
3	(1) meet the qualifications established by the board
4	under Subsection (a);
5	(2) pass the [registration] examination <u>of the</u>
6	National Council for Interior Design Qualification or of a similar
7	national organization recognized by the board; [and]
8	(3) pay the required fees <u>;</u>
9	(4) hold a professional degree in interior design
10	conferred by a design program accredited by the Foundation for
11	Interior Design Education Research or by a substantially equivalent
12	program, as determined by the board; and
13	(5) have completed the Interior Design Experience
14	Program administered by the National Council for Interior Design
15	Qualification or have two years of diversified experience as
16	determined by the board.
17	SECTION 5. Section 1053.154(b), Occupations Code, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	(b) The examination must cover subjects established by and
20	must be graded according to board rules. The board by rule <u>shall</u>
21	[may] adopt the examination of the National Council for Interior
22	Design Qualification or the examination of a similar national
23	organization recognized by the board [comparable examination].
24	SECTION 6. Subchapter D, Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is
25	amended by adding Section 1053.161 to read as follows:
26	Sec. 1053.161. WAIVER OF REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR

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1	registration requirement for an applicant who:
2	(1) is licensed or registered to practice interior
3	design by another state that has licensing or registration
4	requirements at least as stringent as the requirements of this
5	<pre>state;</pre>
6	(2) is in good standing with the state that issued the
7	license or registration;
8	(3) submits an application and pays an administrative
9	fee to the board; and
10	(4) holds a current certificate issued by the National
11	Council for Interior Design Qualification or holds a similar
12	credential recognized by the board.
13	SECTION 7. Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is amended by
14	adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
15	SUBCHAPTER E. PRACTICE BY INTERIOR DESIGNER
16	Sec. 1053.201. RESPONSIBILITY OF AND SUPERVISION BY
17	INTERIOR DESIGNER. (a) Each interior design office must have an
18	interior designer who is responsible for interior design work
19	performed at that location.
20	(b) The responsible interior designer under Subsection (a)
21	shall supervise each nonregistered person working in the interior
22	design office in the practice of interior design. The supervision
23	is not required to be continuous and uninterrupted.
24	Sec. 1053.202. DUTIES TO CLIENT. Before entering into a
25	contract with a client, an interior designer must clearly determine
26	the scope and nature of the project and the method of compensation.
27	Sec. 1053.203. COMPLIANCE WITH CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS. Each

interior designer shall practice in compliance with all applicable 1 2 building codes, fire codes, local regulations, and other safety requirements adopted by the board or another regulatory entity 3 4 implemented to prohibit practice by persons who: 5 (1) fail to practice within the bounds of minimum 6 competency requirements; or 7 (2) otherwise present a danger to the public. SECTION 8. Section 1053.351, Occupations Code, is amended 8 to read as follows: 9 Sec. 1053.351. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) 10 A person commits an offense if the person knowingly violates [Section 1053.151 or a 11 12 standard of conduct adopted under] this chapter or a rule adopted 13 under this chapter. An offense under this section is a [Class C] misdemeanor 14 (b) 15 punishable by a fine of not less than \$250 or more than \$5,000. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense. 16 17 SECTION 9. Section 1053.158, Occupations Code, is repealed. The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners SECTION 10. 18 shall issue a certificate of registration as an interior designer 19 to a person who applies for registration as an interior designer 20 with the board and pays the required fees before the second 21 anniversary of the effective date of this Act if the person presents 22 evidence satisfactory to the board that the person has passed the 23 24 examination of the National Council for Interior Design 25 Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the 26 board. The change in law made by this Act to SECTION 11. (a) 27

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Section 1053.351, Occupations Code, applies only to the punishment for an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before the effective date.

6 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this 7 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was 8 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 9 purpose.

10 SECTION 12. The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners 11 shall adopt rules as required by Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, as 12 amended by this Act, not later than February 1, 2008.

13 SECTION 13. This Act, except for Section 1 of this Act, 14 applies only to an application for an initial or renewal interior 15 designer certificate of registration that is filed with the Texas 16 Board of Architectural Examiners on or after March 1, 2008. An 17 application filed before March 1, 2008, is governed by the law in 18 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the 19 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

20 SECTION 14. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 21 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

(b) Section 1051.3515, Occupations Code, as added by thisAct, takes effect September 1, 2011.
