A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT
relating to offenses involving boating safety.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. The heading to Section 31.099, Parks and
Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:
Sec. 31.099. <u>PROHIBITION ON</u> CIRCULAR COURSE AROUND
INDIVIDUALS ENGAGED IN WATER ACTIVITIES [FISHERMAN OR SWIMMER].
SECTION 2. Section 31.099(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
amended to read as follows:
(a) No person may operate a motorboat in a circular course
around <u>:</u>
(1) any other boat any occupant of which is engaged in
fishing, waterskiing, or a similar activity; or
(2) [around] any person swimming.
SECTION 3. Sections 31.106(a) and (c), Parks and Wildlife
Code, are amended to read as follows:
(a) No person shall operate a personal watercraft in the
following manner or under the following circumstances:
(1) unless each person riding on or towed behind the
vessel is wearing a U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, III, or V
personal flotation device;
(2) if the vessel is equipped by the manufacturer with
a lanyard type engine cutoff switch, unless such lanyard is
attached to the person, clothing, or personal flotation device of

1 the operator as appropriate for the vessel involved; 2 (3) during the period between sunset and sunrise; within 100 [50] feet of any other vessel, person, 3 (4) stationary platform or other object, or shore, except at headway 4 5 speed; 6 (5) if the operator is under 16 years of age, unless 7 the operator: 8 (A) is accompanied by a person at least 18 years 9 of age; or 10 (B) is at least 13 years of age and has successfully completed a boating safety course prescribed and 11 12 approved by the department; if the personal watercraft is a motorboat, within 13 (6) 14 any area prohibited for operation of a motorboat by state law or 15 local rule or regulation; (7) while towing water skis, 16 an aquaplane, а 17 surfboard, a tube, or any other similar device, unless the towing vessel is designed to carry on board a minimum of two persons; 18 by jumping the wake of another vessel recklessly 19 (8) or unnecessarily close to that vessel; or 20 21 in a manner that requires the operator to swerve at (9) the last possible moment to avoid collision. 22 Subsection (a)(4) of this section does not prohibit the 23 (c) 24 operation of personal watercraft on bodies of water less than 200 25  $\left[\frac{100}{100}\right]$  feet in width. SECTION 4. Section 31.107, Parks and Wildlife Code, 26 is amended to read as follows: 27

Sec. 31.107. OPERATION OF MOTORBOAT. (a) 1 No person may 2 operate a motorboat of over 15 horsepower on the public waters of 3 this state unless the person is 16 years of age or older or: 4 (1) is accompanied by a person 18 [(18)] years of age 5 or older; or 6 (2) is at least 13 years of age and has successfully 7 passed a boating safety course prescribed and approved by the 8 department. 9 (b) No person may operate a motorboat within 100 feet of the shore, any other vessel, a person, or a stationary platform or other 10 11 object unless: 12 (1) the boat's speed does not exceed headway speed; (2) the boat is in a no-wake zone; or 13 14 (3) a distance of at least 100 feet is not possible. 15 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 16 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 17 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 18 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 19 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 20 21 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 22 date. SECTION 6. This Act takes effect July 1, 2007, if 23 it 24 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 25 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that 26 date, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007. 27
