## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of the Texas State Board of Podiatric
- 3 Medical Examiners to commission a peace officer.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 202, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 202.164 to read as follows:
- Sec. 202.164. PEACE OFFICERS. (a) The board may commission 7
- as a peace officer to enforce this chapter an employee who has been 8
- 9 certified as qualified to be a peace officer by the Commission on
- Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education. 10
- (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), an employee 11
- 12 commissioned as a peace officer under this section has the powers,
- privileges, and immunities of a peace officer while carrying out 13
- 14 duties as a peace officer under this chapter.
- (c) An employee commissioned as a peace officer under this 15
- 16 section:
- (1) is not entitled to state benefits normally 17
- provided by the state to an employee who is a peace officer; and 18
- (2) may not accept any off-duty employment as a peace 19
- 20 officer.
- 21 SECTION 2. Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- amended to read as follows: 22
- Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace 23
- officers: 24

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- 1 (1) sheriffs, their deputies, and those reserve
- 2 deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under
- 3 Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;
- 4 (2) constables, deputy constables, and those reserve
- 5 deputy constables who hold a permanent peace officer license issued
- 6 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;
- 7 (3) marshals or police officers of an incorporated
- 8 city, town, or village, and those reserve municipal police officers
- 9 who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter
- 10 1701, Occupations Code;
- 11 (4) rangers and officers commissioned by the Public
- 12 Safety Commission and the Director of the Department of Public
- 13 Safety;
- 14 (5) investigators of the district attorneys', criminal
- 15 district attorneys', and county attorneys' offices;
- 16 (6) law enforcement agents of the Texas Alcoholic
- 17 Beverage Commission;
- 18 (7) each member of an arson investigating unit
- 19 commissioned by a city, a county, or the state;
- 20 (8) officers commissioned under Section 37.081,
- 21 Education Code, or Subchapter E, Chapter 51, Education Code;
- 22 (9) officers commissioned by the General Services
- 23 Commission;
- 24 (10) law enforcement officers commissioned by the
- 25 Parks and Wildlife Commission;
- 26 (11) airport police officers commissioned by a city
- 27 with a population of more than 1.18 million that operates an airport

- 1 that serves commercial air carriers;
- 2 (12) airport security personnel commissioned as peace
- 3 officers by the governing body of any political subdivision of this
- 4 state, other than a city described by Subdivision (11), that
- 5 operates an airport that serves commercial air carriers;
- 6 (13) municipal park and recreational patrolmen and
- 7 security officers;
- 8 (14) security officers and investigators commissioned
- 9 as peace officers by the comptroller;
- 10 (15) officers commissioned by a water control and
- improvement district under Section 49.216, Water Code;
- 12 (16) officers commissioned by a board of trustees
- under Chapter 54, Transportation Code;
- 14 (17) investigators commissioned by the Texas Medical
- 15 [State] Board [of Medical Examiners];
- 16 (18) officers commissioned by the board of managers of
- 17 the Dallas County Hospital District, the Tarrant County Hospital
- 18 District, or the Bexar County Hospital District under Section
- 19 281.057, Health and Safety Code;
- 20 (19) county park rangers commissioned under
- 21 Subchapter E, Chapter 351, Local Government Code;
- 22 (20) investigators employed by the Texas Racing
- 23 Commission;
- 24 (21) officers commissioned under Chapter 554,
- 25 Occupations Code;
- 26 (22) officers commissioned by the governing body of a
- 27 metropolitan rapid transit authority under Section 451.108,

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- 1 Transportation Code, or by a regional transportation authority
- 2 under Section 452.110, Transportation Code;
- 3 (23) investigators commissioned by the attorney
- 4 general under Section 402.009, Government Code;
- 5 (24) security officers and investigators commissioned
- as peace officers under Chapter 466, Government Code;
- 7 (25) an officer employed by the [Texas] Department of
- 8 State Health Services under Section 431.2471, Health and Safety
- 9 Code;
- 10 (26) officers appointed by an appellate court under
- 11 Subchapter F, Chapter 53, Government Code;
- 12 (27) officers commissioned by the state fire marshal
- 13 under Chapter 417, Government Code;
- 14 (28) an investigator commissioned by the commissioner
- of insurance under <u>Section 701.104</u> [Article 1.10D], Insurance Code;
- 16 (29) apprehension specialists commissioned by the
- 17 Texas Youth Commission as officers under Section 61.0931, Human
- 18 Resources Code;
- 19 (30) officers appointed by the executive director of
- 20 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice under Section 493.019,
- 21 Government Code;
- 22 (31) investigators commissioned by the Commission on
- 23 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education under Section
- 24 1701.160, Occupations Code;
- 25 (32) commission investigators commissioned by the
- 26 Texas [Commission on] Private Security Board under Section
- 27 1702.061(f), Occupations Code;

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- 1 (33) the fire marshal and any officers, inspectors, or
- 2 investigators commissioned by an emergency services district under
- 3 Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code; [and]
- 4 (34) officers commissioned by the State Board of
- 5 Dental Examiners under Section 254.013, Occupations Code, subject
- 6 to the limitations imposed by that section; and
- 7 (35) officers commissioned by the Texas State Board of
- 8 Podiatric Medical Examiners under Section 202.164, Occupations
- 9 Code, subject to the limitations imposed by that section.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
