A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the continuation and functions of the Texas Historical 3 Commission.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 442.002(b) and (k), Government Code, 6 are amended to read as follows:

(b) The commission is composed of 17 members appointed by 7 the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. One member 8 must be a professional archeologist, one must be a professional 9 historian, and one must be a licensed architect who has expertise in 10 11 historic preservation and architectural history. Fourteen members 12 must be representatives of the general public. A person may [is] 13 not be [eligible for appointment as] a public member of the 14 commission if the person or the person's spouse:

(1) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
organization regulated by the commission or receiving <u>money</u> [funds]
other than grant <u>money</u> [funds] from the commission; [or]

uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
 goods, services, or money [funds] from the commission, other than
 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for commission
 membership, attendance, or expenses; or

23 (3) is employed by or participates in the management
 24 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or

1	receiving money other than grant money from the commission.
2	(k) The Texas Historical Commission is subject to Chapter
3	325 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
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4	by that chapter, the commission is abolished and this chapter
5	expires September 1, <u>2019</u> [2007].
6	SECTION 2. Section 442.0021, Government Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 442.0021. COMMISSION MEMBERS: TRAINING. (a) <u>A person</u>
9	who is appointed to and qualifies for office as a member of the
10	commission may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in

No. 900 conflicts of interest [(3) the role and functions of the 1 2 commission]; and (5) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the 3 4 commission or the Texas Ethics Commission [(4) the rules of the commission with an emphasis on the rules that relate to 5 6 disciplinary and investigatory authority; [(5) the current budget for the commission; 7 8 [(6) the results of the most recent formal audit of the 9 commission; [(7) the requirements of the: 10 [(A) open meetings law, Chapter 551; 11 [(B) open records law, Chapter 552; and 12 [(C) administrative procedure law, Chapter 2001; 13 [(8) the requirements of the conflict of interest laws 14 15 and other laws relating to public officials; and 16 [(9) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the commission or the Texas Ethics Commission]. 17 (c) A person appointed to the commission is entitled to 18 reimbursement, as provided by the General Appropriations Act, for 19 the travel expenses incurred in attending the training program 20 21 regardless of whether the attendance at the program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office. 22 SECTION 3. Sections 442.0022(a) and (b), Government Code, 23 24 are amended to read as follows: In this section, "Texas trade association" means a 25 (a) cooperative and voluntarily joined statewide association of 26 business or professional competitors in this state designed to 27

assist its members and its industry or profession in dealing with 1 2 mutual business or professional problems and in promoting their common interest [An officer, employee, or paid consultant of a 3 4 Texas trade association in the field of archeology or historic preservation may not be a member of the commission or employee of 5 the commission who is exempt from the state's position 6 classification plan or is compensated at or above the amount 7 8 prescribed by the General Appropriations Act for step 1, salary 9 group 17, of the position classification salary schedule]. A person may not be a member of the commission and may 10 (b) not be a commission employee employed in a "bona fide executive, 11 administrative, or professional capacity," as that phrase is used 12 for purposes of establishing an exemption to the overtime 13

14 provisions of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 15 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.) if:

16 <u>(1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid</u> 17 <u>consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of archeology</u> 18 <u>or historic preservation; or</u>

(2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid 19 20 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of archeology 21 or historic preservation [A person who is the spouse of an officer, 22 manager, or paid consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of archeology or historic preservation may not be a member of 23 24 the commission and may not be an employee of the commission who is exempt from the state's position classification plan or is 25 compensated at or above the amount prescribed by the General 26 Appropriations Act for step 1, salary group 17, of the position 27

2	SECTION 4. Section 442.004, Government Code, is amended by
3	adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
4	(b-1) The executive director may not serve as a voting
5	director on the board of directors of an affiliated nonprofit
6	organization formed under Section 442.005(p).
7	SECTION 5. Subchapter A, Chapter 442, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 442.0055 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 442.0055. AFFILIATED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION; RULES;
10	GUIDELINES. (a) The commission shall adopt rules governing the
11	relationship between the commission and an affiliated nonprofit
12	organization formed under Section 442.005(p), including rules
13	that, at a minimum:
14	(1) prohibit commission employees with regulatory
15	responsibilities, including the executive director, from directly
16	participating in activities that raise funds for an affiliated
17	nonprofit organization; and
18	(2) define the relationship between commission
19	employees and an affiliated nonprofit organization.
20	(b) The commission shall establish guidelines for
21	identifying and defining the administrative and financial support
22	the commission may provide for an affiliated nonprofit organization
23	formed under Section 442.005(p).
24	SECTION 6. Section 442.006, Government Code, is amended by
25	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (h) to read as
26	follows:
27	(b) The commission shall <u>:</u>

No. 900 (1) develop statewide themes for the program related 1 2 to the commission's preservation goals for the state; (2) install markers recognizing districts, sites, 3 individuals, events, structures, and objects significant in Texas 4 5 or American history, architecture, archeology, or culture; 6 (3) [and shall] keep a register of those markers; and 7 (4) establish a limit for the number of markers the 8 commission awards annually. (h) The commission by rule shall establish guidelines for an 9 application for, and the commission's review of the application 10 for, a historical marker, monument, or medallion. The guidelines 11 12 must include criteria for ranking the applications. The commission shall give priority to the markers, monuments, and medallions that 13 14 relate to the statewide themes developed by the commission. 15 SECTION 7. Sections 442.009(a), (b), and (c), Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 16 17 (a) The commission shall maintain a system to promptly and efficiently act on complaints filed with the commission. 18 The commission shall maintain information about parties to the 19 complaint, the subject matter of the complaint, a summary of the 20 21 results of the review or investigation of the complaint, and its disposition [prepare information of public interest describing the 22 functions of the commission and the procedures by which complaints 23 24 are filed with and resolved by the commission. The commission shall 25 make the information available to the public and appropriate state 26 agencies]. 27 (b) The commission [by rule] shall make information

1	available describing its procedures for complaint investigation
2	and resolution [establish methods by which consumers and service
3	recipients are notified of the name, mailing address, and telephone
4	number of the commission for the purpose of directing complaints to
5	the commission].
6	(c) The commission shall periodically notify the complaint
7	parties of the status of the complaint until final disposition
8	[keep information about each complaint filed with the commission.
9	The information shall include:
10	[(1) the date the complaint is received;
11	[(2) the name of the complainant;
12	[(3) the subject matter of the complaint;
13	[(4) a record of all persons contacted in relation to
14	the complaint;
15	[(5) a summary of the results of the review or
16	investigation of the complaint; and
17	[(6) for complaints for which the agency took no
18	action, an explanation of the reason the complaint was closed
19	without action].
20	SECTION 8. Subchapter A, Chapter 442, Government Code, is
21	amended by adding Sections 442.022 and 442.023 to read as follows:
22	Sec. 442.022. USE OF TECHNOLOGY. The commission shall
23	implement a policy requiring the commission to use appropriate
24	technological solutions to improve the commission's ability to
25	perform its functions. The policy must ensure that the public is
26	able to interact with the commission on the Internet.
27	Sec. 442.023. NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING AND ALTERNATIVE

DISPUTE PROCEDURES. (a) The commission shall develop and 1 implement a policy to encourage the use of: 2 3 (1) negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter 4 2008 for the adoption of commission rules; and (2) appropriate alternative dispute resolution 5 6 procedures under Chapter 2009 to assist in the resolution of internal and external disputes under the commission's 7 8 jurisdiction. 9 (b) The commission's procedures relating to alternative dispute resolution must conform, to the extent possible, to any 10 model guidelines issued by the State Office of Administrative 11 12 Hearings for the use of alternative dispute resolution by state 13 agencies. 14 (c) The commission shall designate a trained person to: 15 (1) coordinate the implementation of the policy adopted under Subsection (a); 16 17 (2) serve as a resource for any training needed to implement the procedures for negotiated rulemaking or alternative 18 19 dispute resolution; and (3) collect data concerning the effectiveness of those 20 21 procedures, as implemented by the commission. SECTION 9. Sections 442.0022(c) and 442.009(d), Government 22 Code, are repealed. 23 24 SECTION 10. Not later than February 1, 2008, the Texas 25 Historical Commission shall adopt the rules required by Sections 442.0055 and 442.006(h), Government Code, as added by this Act. 26 SECTION 11. (a) The changes in law made by this Act in the 27

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prohibitions or qualifications applying to a member of the Texas Historical Commission do not affect the entitlement of a member serving on the Texas Historical Commission immediately before September 1, 2007, to continue to serve and function as a member of the Texas Historical Commission for the remainder of the member's term. Those changes in law apply only to a member appointed on or after September 1, 2007.

8 (b) The changes in law made by this Act to Section 442.009, 9 Government Code, relating to the investigation of a complaint filed 10 with the Texas Historical Commission apply only to a complaint 11 filed on or after September 1, 2007. A complaint filed with the 12 commission before September 1, 2007, is governed by the law as it 13 existed immediately before that date, and the former law is 14 continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
