A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to an exemption from reactivation and continuing education 3 requirements for certain honorably retired peace officers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 1701.356, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 1701.356. CERTAIN RETIRED DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY 7 OFFICERS: REACTIVATION AND CONTINUING EDUCATION NOT REQUIRED. 8 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is 9 amended by adding Section 1701.3561 to read as follows: 10 Sec. 1701.3561. CERTAIN RETIRED PEACE OFFICERS: 11 12 REACTIVATION AND CONTINUING EDUCATION NOT REQUIRED. (a) In this 13 section, "honorably retired peace officer" means a peace officer 14 who: (1) is not currently serving as an elected, appointed, 15 16 or employed peace officer under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law; 17 18 (2) did not retire in lieu of any disciplinary action; (3) was eligible to retire from a law enforcement 19 agency in this state or was ineligible to retire only as a result of 20 21 an injury received in the course of the officer's employment with the agency; and 22 (4) is eligible to receive a pension or annuity for 23 service as a law enforcement officer in this state or is ineligible 24

1	to receive a pension or annuity only because the law enforcement
2	agency that employed the officer does not offer a pension or annuity
3	to its employees.
4	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (d), an honorably
5	retired peace officer may not be required to undergo training under
6	Section 1701.352(b).
7	(c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), an honorably
8	retired peace officer:
9	(1) has the same rights and privileges as any other
10	peace officer of this state;
11	(2) holds, notwithstanding Sections 1701.159 and
12	1701.316, an active license unless the license is revoked,
13	suspended, or probated by the commission for a violation of this
14	chapter; and
15	(3) is not subject to Section 1701.351 or any other
16	continuing education requirement imposed by law.
17	(d) An honorably retired peace officer who is subsequently
18	elected, appointed, or employed to serve as a peace officer under
19	Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law must:
20	(1) complete the continuing education requirements
21	provided by Section 1701.351 and any other continuing education
22	requirement imposed by law; and
23	(2) demonstrate weapons proficiency as required by
24	Section 1701.355.
25	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
26	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
27	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
