- 6 SECTION 1. Section 521.126(d), Transportation Code, as
- 7 amended by Chapters 391 and 1189, Acts of the 79th Legislature,
- 8 Regular Session, 2005, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (d) The prohibition provided by Subsection (b) does not
- 10 apply to a person who accesses, uses, compiles, or maintains a
- 11 database of the information for a law enforcement or governmental
- 12 purpose, including:
- 13 (1) an officer or employee of the department carrying
- 14 out law enforcement or government purposes;
- 15 (2) a peace officer, as defined by Article 2.12, Code
- of Criminal Procedure, acting in the officer's official capacity;
- 17 (3) a license deputy, as defined by Section 12.702,
- 18 Parks and Wildlife Code, issuing a license, stamp, tag, permit, or
- 19 other similar item through use of a point-of-sale system under
- 20 Section 12.703, Parks and Wildlife Code;
- 21 (4) a person acting as authorized by Section 109.61,

- 6 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, that sponsors
- 7 <u>a program for youth</u>.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
