9	offense under this section is a felony of the second degree. An
10	offense under this section is a felony of the first degree if:
11	(1) the offense is committed under Subsection (a)(2)
12	and the person who is trafficked is younger than $\underline{18}$ [$\underline{14}$] years of
13	age at the time of the offense; or
14	(2) the commission of the offense results in the death
15	of the person who is trafficked.
16	SECTION 2. (a) Not later than September 1, 2008, the
17	attorney general, in consultation with the Health and Human
18	Services Commission, shall issue a report:
19	(1) outlining how existing laws and regulations
20	concerning victims and witnesses address the needs of victims of
21	human trafficking; and
22	(2) recommending areas of improvement and
23	modifications.
24	(b) Not later than September 1, 2008, the Health and Human

Services Commission, in consultation with the attorney general,
 shall issue a report:

3 (1) outlining how existing social service programs 4 address or fail to address the needs of victims of human 5 trafficking;

6 (2) outlining the interplay of existing social service
7 programs with federally funded victim service programs; and

8 (3) recommending areas of improvement and 9 modifications.

SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act to Subsection (b), Section 20A.02, Penal Code, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before that date.

(b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
