A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to an interim study concerning alcohol-related offenses,
- 3 alcohol awareness, and treatment for alcohol dependency in this
- 4 state.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. ALCOHOL AWARENESS STUDY COMMITTEE. (a) An
- 7 interim committee is created to study laws and regulations relating
- 8 to alcohol-related offenses, alcohol awareness, and treatment for
- 9 alcohol dependency, and to recommend methods to decrease the
- 10 incidence of alcohol abuse in the state. The committee's study must
- 11 include an examination of:
- 12 (1) state agencies that are involved in:
- 13 (A) efforts to reduce alcohol-related motor
- vehicle accidents and offenses in the state;
- 15 (B) programs to reduce alcohol dependence,
- 16 including education and treatment services; and
- 17 (C) initiating and implementing alcohol
- awareness campaigns to reduce alcohol abuse;
- 19 (2) the feasibility of creating a separate state
- 20 agency to oversee regulation of alcohol dependency and alcohol
- 21 awareness programs and services and to administer alcohol-related
- 22 laws; and
- 23 (3) the fiscal implications of creating a separate
- 24 state agency described by Subdivision (2).

- 1 (b) The committee consists of the following nine members:
- 2 (1) four members appointed by the lieutenant governor,
- 3 two of whom must be senators and two of whom must be members of the
- 4 public;
- 5 (2) four members appointed by the speaker of the house
- of representatives, two of whom must be representatives and two of
- 7 whom must be members of the public; and
- 8 (3) one member appointed by the governor, who must be a
- 9 member of the public and shall serve as the committee's presiding
- 10 officer.
- 11 (c) The committee shall convene at the call of the presiding
- 12 officer.
- 13 (d) The committee has all other powers and duties provided
- 14 to a special or select committee by the rules of the senate and
- 15 house of representatives, by Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government
- 16 Code, and by policies of the senate and house committees on
- 17 administration.
- (e) From the contingent expense fund of the senate and the
- 19 contingent expense fund of the house of representatives equally,
- 20 the members of the committee are entitled to reimbursement for
- 21 expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this Act in
- 22 accordance with the rules of the senate and house of
- 23 representatives and the policies of the senate and house committees
- 24 on administration.
- 25 (f) Not later than January 15, 2009, the committee shall
- 26 report the committee's findings and recommendations to the
- 27 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,

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- 1 and the governor. The committee shall include in its
- 2 recommendations specific statutory changes that appear necessary
- 3 from the results of the committee's study under Subsection (a).
- 4 (g) Not later than the 60th day after the effective date of
- 5 this Act, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 6 representatives, and the governor shall appoint the members of the
- 7 interim committee created under this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2009.
- 9 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 10 1, 2007.
