A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of commercially operated party boats on
3	public water of this state.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 31, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter G to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER G. PARTY BOATS
8	Sec. 31.171. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Licensed party boat operator" means a person
10	issued a license by the department under this subchapter.
11	(2) "Party boat" means a vessel:
12	(A) operated by the owner of the vessel or an
13	employee of the owner; and
14	(B) rented or leased by the owner for a group
15	recreational event for more than six passengers.
16	Sec. 31.172. APPLICABILITY; EXCEPTION. (a) This
17	subchapter applies only to a party boat that operates on the inland
18	waters of this state.
19	(b) This subchapter does not apply to a boat that is less
20	than 30 feet in length or to a sailboat.
21	Sec. 31.173. PARTY BOAT OPERATOR AND STAFF. (a) Except as
22	provided by Subsection (c), the party boat owner shall provide
23	staff members, including a licensed party boat operator, who:
24	(1) operate and staff the party boat for the duration

- of a rental or lease for a group recreational event as follows:
- 2 (A) for a boat with not more than 25 passengers,
- 3 one staff member who is an operator;
- 4 (B) for a boat with at least 26 but not more than
- 5 50 passengers, two staff members, including one operator; and
- 6 (C) for a boat with more than 50 passengers,
- 7 three staff members, including one operator; and
- 8 (2) have each successfully completed a boater safety
- 9 course approved under this chapter.
- 10 (b) At least one staff member on the boat must be certified
- 11 to conduct cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
- (c) This section does not apply to a party boat rented or
- leased for an overnight or longer period for which the owner, or the
- 14 owner's staff, does not intend to remain in constant possession,
- 15 command, and control of the party boat.
- Sec. 31.174. BOAT REQUIREMENTS. A party boat:
- 17 <u>(1) may not carry more than the maximum number of</u>
- 18 passengers the boat may safely accommodate as determined by the
- 19 department on inspection;
- 20 (2) must have a direct and reliable communication
- 21 connection to the land-based office of the owner and law
- 22 enforcement and emergency services by cellular telephone or very
- 23 <u>high frequency radio; and</u>
- 24 <u>(3) must pass an annual water safety inspection</u>
- 25 conducted by the department or a person under contract with the
- 26 department.
- Sec. 31.175. PASSENGER SAFETY INFORMATION; INSURANCE.

- 1 (a) The owner of a party boat shall provide each passenger with
- 2 written and verbal safety information and require each passenger to
- 3 sign a form acknowledging that the passenger reviewed and
- 4 understands the information.
- 5 (b) The verbal and written safety information must disclose
- 6 that no lifeguard is present on the party boat if there is not at
- 7 least one staff member on the boat who is certified as a lifeguard
- 8 by the American Red Cross, the American Lifeguard Association, or
- 9 another comparable nationally recognized organization.
- 10 (c) The owner of a party boat must obtain at least a minimum
- 11 <u>amount of liability insurance from an insurer licensed to do</u>
- business in this state. The commission shall set the amount.
- 13 Sec. 31.176. PARTY BOAT OPERATOR LICENSE. (a) The
- 14 commission by rule shall establish, as necessary to protect the
- 15 public health and safety, the requirements and procedures for the
- 16 <u>issuance</u> and renewal of a party boat operator license under this
- 17 subchapter.
- 18 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the rules for
- 19 obtaining a license as a party boat operator must require at a
- 20 minimum that the applicant:
- 21 (1) be at least 21 years of age;
- (2) observe for at least four hours a licensed party
- 23 boat operator operating a party boat on open water;
- 24 (3) operate for at least four hours a party boat on
- open water while being supervised and observed by a licensed party
- 26 boat operator; and
- 27 (4) pass a written examination covering onboard safety

- 1 procedures and the applicable provisions of this chapter.
- 2 <u>(c) An applicant is not required to comply with Subsections</u>
- 3 (b)(2) and (3) if the applicant has:
- 4 (1) at least 25 hours of experience operating a party
- 5 boat as shown by appropriate documentation; and
- 6 (2) no record of boating violations.
- 7 Sec. 31.177. FEES. (a) The commission by rule shall
- 8 establish and collect a reasonable fee for:
- 9 <u>(1) the issuance of a party boat operator license</u>
- 10 under this subchapter; and
- 11 (2) the annual water safety inspection of a party boat
- 12 required by this subchapter.
- 13 (b) A fee collected by the department under this subchapter
- 14 and any interest that accrues on the fee shall be deposited to the
- 15 <u>credit of the game, fish, and water safety account established</u>
- 16 under Section 11.032.
- Sec. 31.178. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING. If a party boat is
- 18 involved in an accident causing serious personal injury or death,
- 19 each staff member on board is subject to mandatory drug and alcohol
- 20 testing.
- Sec. 31.179. ENFORCEMENT. (a) In addition to a game
- 22 warden, any peace officer of a municipality or other political
- 23 subdivision of this state who is certified as a marine safety
- 24 enforcement officer under Section 31.121 may enforce this
- 25 subchapter:
- 26 (1) in the area of a navigable body of water that is in
- 27 the jurisdiction of the municipality or other political

- 1 subdivision; or
- 2 (2) in any part of a lake that is partly or wholly
- 3 inside the boundaries of:
- 4 (A) the municipality or its extraterritorial
- 5 <u>jurisdiction</u>; or
- 6 (B) the political subdivision.
- 7 (b) A party boat is subject to enforcement inspections
- 8 <u>conducted under Section 31.124.</u>
- 9 Sec. 31.180. RULES. The commission shall adopt and enforce
- 10 rules necessary to implement this subchapter.
- 11 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2008, the Parks and
- 12 Wildlife Commission shall adopt rules to implement Subchapter G,
- 13 Chapter 31, Parks and Wildlife Code, as added by this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 31, Parks and Wildlife
- 15 Code, as added by this Act, applies only to the rental or lease of a
- 16 party boat on the public water of this state for a group
- 17 recreational event held on or after June 1, 2008.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
