6	amended by adding Chapter 46B to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 46B. DEMONSTRATION OF REGIONAL DELIVERY OF TERTIARY MEDICAL

9	Sec. 46B.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
11	Services.
12	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
13	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
14	(3) "Public health region three" means the public
15	health region under Chapter 121 designated by the department as
16	public health region three.
17	(4) "Regional board" means the tertiary medical
18	services regional board created under this chapter.
19	(5) "Tertiary care facility" has the meaning assigned
20	by Section 46.001.
21	(6) "Tertiary medical services" has the meaning
22	assigned by Section 46.001.
23	Sec. 46B.002. REGIONAL DEMONSTRATION PROJECT. (a) The
24	department shall establish a demonstration project in public health

1	region three to develop and implement a regional approach to the
2	delivery of tertiary medical services.
3	(b) A county, municipality, hospital district, or tertiary
4	care facility in public health region three may elect to
5	participate in the demonstration project by notifying the
6	department in accordance with rules adopted by the executive
7	commissioner.
8	Sec. 46B.003. RULES. The executive commissioner may adopt
9	rules for the implementation of the demonstration project under
10	this chapter.
11	Sec. 46B.004. TERTIARY MEDICAL SERVICES REGIONAL BOARD.
12	(a) The executive commissioner shall establish the tertiary medical
13	services regional board to administer the demonstration project
14	under this chapter. Members of the regional board serve two-year
15	terms.
16	(b) The regional board is composed of:
17	(1) one member representing each participating
18	county, municipality, or hospital district appointed by the county,
19	municipality, or hospital district;
20	(2) one member appointed by the executive commissioner
21	as nominated by the participating tertiary care facilities; and
22	(3) the chief executive officer of the department or a
23	representative appointed by the chief executive officer.
24	(c) The regional board shall elect a presiding officer and
25	adopt rules governing the administration of the regional board.
26	(d) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
27	regional board.

1	Sec. 46B.005. REGIONAL BOARD DUTIES. (a) The regional
2	board shall develop and implement a system for the delivery of
3	tertiary medical services on a regional basis.
4	(b) In developing the system, the regional board shall:
5	(1) assess:
6	(A) the tertiary medical services needs of the
7	region; and
8	(B) the need for additional tertiary medical
9	services in the region, including the types of services needed and
10	the levels of services needed;
11	(2) inventory the tertiary medical services available
12	in the region;
13	(3) identify sources and methods of funding for the
14	provision of tertiary medical services in the region; and
15	(4) make recommendations to the Health and Human
16	Services Commission and the department regarding implementation of
17	the demonstration project.
18	(c) In implementing the system, the board shall:
19	(1) contract with providers to provide tertiary
20	medical services to eligible individuals in the region;
21	(2) coordinate payments for tertiary medical services
22	to participating providers; and
23	(3) monitor the progress of the demonstration project.

25	PROVIDED THROUGH DEMONSTRATION PROJECT. (a) The regional board
26	shall establish minimum eligibility standards and application,
27	documentation, and verification procedures for participating

1	entities to use in determining eligibility of persons receiving
2	tertiary medical services under this chapter. The eligibility
3	standards must be coordinated with the standards applicable for
4	each participating entity under Chapter 61.
5	(b) The minimum eligibility standards must:
6	(1) include a person who is a resident of a county in
7	public health region three, regardless of the county's
8	participation in the demonstration project; and
9	(2) incorporate a net income eligibility level equal
10	to 100 percent of the federal poverty level based on the federal
11	Office of Management and Budget poverty index.
12	(c) For a person who is located within the boundaries of a
13	county, municipality, or hospital district within public health
14	region three that is not served by a provider of tertiary medical
15	services, the minimum eligibility standards may incorporate a net
16	income eligibility level that is less than 200 percent of the
17	federal poverty level based on the federal Office of Management and
18	Budget poverty index. The regional board may provide for a
19	different level of reimbursement for tertiary medical services
20	provided to a person described by this subsection.
21	Sec. 46B.007. FUNDS FOR DEMONSTRATION PROJECT. (a) The
22	regional board may accept and use local, state, and federal funds
23	and private donations to fund the demonstration project.
24	(b) State, local, and private funds may be used to qualify
25	for federal matching funds that are available to fund the
26	demonstration project.
27	(c) A participating county, municipality, hospital

1	district, or tertiary care facility may contribute funds to the
2	regional board for use in the demonstration project.
3	(d) The regional board shall deposit money received under
4	this section other than state and federal funds into an account
5	maintained by the comptroller outside the state treasury and
6	administered by the regional board.
7	(e) Funds received from a participating county,
8	municipality, hospital district, or tertiary care facility under
9	this section may be used only to pay for:
10	(1) tertiary medical services provided to eligible
11	residents by contracted providers;
12	(2) expanding the type or level of tertiary medical
13	services available to eligible residents in the region;
14	(3) the costs incurred by the regional board in
15	administering the demonstration project;
16	(4) programs and grants to enhance the health of
17	eligible residents; and
18	(5) other appropriate expenses related to the
19	demonstration project.
20	(f) The regional board shall adopt procedures to ensure that
21	money from the account administered by the board is used for a
22	purpose described by Subsection (e).
23	(g) Funds remaining in an account administered by the
24	regional board when the demonstration project ends shall be
25	distributed to each participating entity in proportion to the
26	contribution made by the entity.
27	Sec. 46B.008. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2010,

1	the regional board shall submit a report to the executive
2	commissioner, the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the
3	speaker of the house of representatives regarding:
4	(1) the results of the demonstration project; and
5	(2) the regional board's recommendations regarding the
6	further development and implementation of the regional delivery of
7	tertiary medical services.
8	Sec. 46B.009. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September
9	<u>1, 2011.</u>
10	SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
11	a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
12	federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
13	the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
14	authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
