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AN ACT

2 relating to course requirements for students enrolled in joint 3 degree programs between certain general academic teaching 4 institutions and foreign universities.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 51.301, Education Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c), (d), and (e) to 8 read as follows:

Every college and university receiving state support or 9 (a) state aid from public funds shall give a course of instruction in 10 government or political science which includes consideration of the 11 Constitution of the United States and the constitutions of the 12 13 states, with special emphasis on that of Texas. This course shall have a credit value of not less than six semester hours or its 14 15 equivalent. Except as provided by Subsection (c), a [No] college or university receiving state support or state aid from public funds 16 may not grant a baccalaureate degree or a lesser degree or academic 17 certificate to any person unless the person [he] has credit for such 18 19 a course. The college or university may determine that a student has satisfied this requirement in whole or in part on the basis of 20 credit granted to the student [him] by the college or university for 21 22 a substantially equivalent course completed at another accredited 23 college or university or on the basis of the student's successful 24 completion of an advanced standing examination administered on the

1 conditions and under the circumstances common for the college or 2 university's advanced standing examinations. The college or 3 university may grant as much as three semester hours of credit or 4 its equivalent toward satisfaction of this requirement for 5 substantially equivalent work completed by the student in the 6 program of an approved senior R.O.T.C. unit.

7 <u>(c) The governing board of a general academic teaching</u> 8 <u>institution that offers a joint baccalaureate degree program under</u> 9 <u>a contract with a foreign college or university may exempt a student</u> 10 <u>enrolled in the joint degree program from the course requirement</u> 11 <u>prescribed by Subsection (a) if the student:</u>

12 <u>(1) enrolled in the foreign college or university</u> 13 <u>before enrolling in the joint degree program or is otherwise</u> 14 <u>considered to be primarily a student of the foreign college or</u> 15 <u>university; and</u>

16 (2) successfully completes the American Way course 17 described by Subsection (d) at the institution the student attends 18 or, with the approval of that institution, at another general 19 academic teaching institution that offers the course.

(d) The American Way course authorized by Subsection (c)(2) 20 must be designed to provide a foreign student with a familiarity and 21 22 understanding of United States government and civic life and their sources, development, and character. The course must concentrate 23 on important texts, including the United States Constitution and 24 25 the Declaration of Independence, on the works and contributions of influential authors, political and cultural leaders, and other 26 27 important figures, and on important events and developments in

1	United States history. The course must cover important
2	developments in human and civil rights, including the civil rights
3	movement and the history of women's rights. The course must cover
4	the history and development of the State of Texas and its place in
5	United States history and culture. The course must consist of four
6	semester credit hours, with one semester credit hour in practicum
7	activities intended to provide the student with experience in the
8	three branches of government through participation at the federal,
9	state, or local level. The course may not be taken for course
10	credit by a student other than a student described by Subsection
11	<u>(c).</u>
12	(e) In this section, "general academic teaching
13	institution" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
14	SECTION 2. Section 51.302, Education Code, is amended to
15	read as follows:
16	Sec. 51.302. AMERICAN OR TEXAS HISTORY. (a) In this
17	section, "general academic teaching institution" has the meaning
18	assigned by Section 61.003.
19	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a [No] college or
20	university receiving state support or state aid from public funds
21	may <u>not</u> grant a baccalaureate degree or a lesser degree or academic
22	certificate to any person unless <u>the person</u> [he] has credit for six
23	semester hours or its equivalent in American History. A student is
24	entitled to submit as much as three semester hours of credit or its
25	equivalent in Texas History in partial satisfaction of this
26	requirement. The college or university may determine that a
27	student has satisfied this requirement in whole or part on the basis

of credit granted to the student [him] by the college or university 1 2 for a substantially equivalent course completed at another 3 accredited college or university, or on the basis of the student's 4 successful completion of an advanced standing examination administered on the conditions and under the circumstances common 5 6 for the college or university's advanced standing examinations. 7 The college or university may grant as much as three semester hours of credit or its equivalent toward satisfaction of this requirement 8 9 for substantially equivalent work completed by a student in the 10 program of an approved senior R.O.T.C. unit.

11 (c) The governing board of a general academic teaching 12 institution that offers a joint baccalaureate degree program under 13 a contract with a foreign college or university may exempt a student 14 enrolled in the joint degree program from the course requirement 15 prescribed by Subsection (b) if the student:

16 <u>(1) enrolled in the foreign college or university</u> 17 <u>before enrolling in the joint degree program or is otherwise</u> 18 <u>considered to be primarily a student of the foreign college or</u> 19 <u>university; and</u>

20 (2) successfully completes the American Way course 21 described by Section 51.301(d) at the institution the student 22 attends or, with the approval of that institution, at another 23 general academic teaching institution that offers the course.

24 SECTION 3. Section 61.822, Education Code, is amended by 25 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:

(e) The governing board of a general academic teaching
institution that offers a joint baccalaureate degree program under

1 <u>a contract with a foreign college or university may, in</u> 2 <u>consultation with the foreign college or university, identify and</u> 3 <u>approve courses offered by the foreign college or university that</u> 4 <u>are equivalent to, and may substitute for, courses in the core</u> 5 <u>curriculum of a student enrolled in the joint degree program who is</u> 6 <u>considered to be primarily a student of the general academic</u> 7 <u>teaching institution.</u>

8 SECTION 4. The governing board of an institution of higher 9 education to which Subsection (e), Section 61.822, Education Code, 10 as added by this Act, applies may permit a student enrolled in a 11 joint degree program to which that section applies to substitute 12 another course for a course in the core curriculum as permitted by 13 that section regardless of whether the student completed the course 14 before the effective date of this Act.

15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
