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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to tuition credits for students who complete the core
3	curriculum at two-year public institutions of higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter Z to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER Z. OTHER STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS
8	Sec. 56.901. TUITION CREDITS FOR STUDENT COMPLETING CORE
9	CURRICULUM AT TWO-YEAR INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) In
10	this section:
11	(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
12	Education Coordinating Board.
13	(2) "General academic teaching institution," "public
14	junior college," "public state college," and "public technical
15	institute" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
16	(b) The coordinating board shall establish a program under
17	which an eligible student is entitled to receive credit against a
18	portion of the tuition charged by a general academic teaching
19	institution to the student during the student's enrollment at that
20	institution.
21	(c) A student is eligible to receive tuition credit under
22	this section if the student:
23	(1) is a resident of this state;
24	(2) enrolls at a public junior college, public state

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1	college, or public technical institute not later than the first
2	fall semester following the student's graduation from high school;
3	(3) successfully completes the core curriculum at a
4	public junior college, public state college, or public technical
5	institute before the third fall semester following the student's
6	graduation from high school, regardless of whether the student:
7	(A) remains continuously enrolled at the same
8	college or institute during that period; or
9	(B) completes any portion of the core curriculum
10	through concurrent enrollment;
11	(4) after completing the core curriculum as described
12	by Subdivision (3), enrolls at a general academic teaching
13	institution not later than the third fall semester following the
14	student's graduation from high school;
15	(5) meets financial need requirements prescribed by
16	coordinating board rule; and
17	(6) complies with any additional eligibility
18	requirements prescribed by coordinating board rule.
19	(d) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (e), an
20	eligible student is entitled to a tuition credit in an amount equal
21	to one-fourth of the total amount of tuition charged for each
22	semester or other academic term in which the student is enrolled at
23	the general academic teaching institution, excluding tuition
24	charged under Section 54.0513 or another provision authorizing the
25	institution to establish tuition rates. A student may use a tuition
26	credit only for the semester or term for which it is awarded.
27	(e) Except as provided by Subsection (k), a student is not

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1	eligible for a tuition credit under this section for a semester or
2	other term that begins after the second anniversary of the date the
3	student first enrolled at the general academic teaching
4	institution.
5	(f) For the applicable enrollment period, a general
6	academic teaching institution shall apply to a student's tuition
7	charges the amount of the tuition credit to which the student is
8	entitled.
9	(g) As soon as practicable after a tuition credit is used
10	under this section, the general academic teaching institution shall
11	report to the coordinating board the name of the student using the
12	credit and the amount of credit used.
13	(h) A general academic teaching institution is entitled to
14	reimbursement for the cost of providing a tuition credit to an
15	eligible student under this section. The coordinating board shall
16	reimburse the institution in the appropriate amount from
17	appropriations available for that purpose.
18	(i) At the beginning of each school year, each public high
19	school in this state shall provide information regarding the
20	requirements of the program under this section to each senior
21	student enrolled at the high school and to a parent, conservator, or
22	guardian of the student. Each public junior college, public state
23	college, or public technical institute shall notify each entering
24	undergraduate student of the program requirements not later than
25	the sixth week of the student's first semester or term.
26	(j) The Texas Education Agency and the coordinating board
27	jointly shall prepare a publication that includes the information

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required to be provided under Subsection (i) and shall post that 1 publication on the website of each in a form that enables a public 2 3 high school, public junior college, public state college, or public technical institute to reproduce the information for distribution 4 to students, parents, and other persons as required by this 5 6 section. 7 (k) The coordinating board shall adopt rules to administer this section, including rules requiring an eligible student to 8 apply for a tuition credit under this section and to provide the 9 10 information required to verify the student's eligibility. The rules must provide procedures by which an otherwise eligible 11 student may be granted additional time to receive or use tuition 12 13 credits under this section if the student shows hardship or other good cause that prevented the student from successfully completing 14 the core curriculum, using the tuition credits, or enrolling in an 15 16 institution within the applicable period prescribed by this section. For purposes of this subsection, hardship or other good 17 18 cause includes: 19 (1) a severe illness or other debilitating condition; 20 (2) responsibility for the care of a sick or injured person or person otherwise in need of assistance; or 21 22 (3) active duty or other service in the United States armed forces. 23 (1) A student may not receive a tuition credit under this 24 25 section for a semester or term before the 2009 fall semester, and may not establish eligibility for a credit based in any part on 26 27 higher education coursework completed before the 2007 fall

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## 1 semester. This subsection expires January 1, 2011.

2 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 3 of this Act, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 4 adopt rules for the administration of Section 56.901, Education 5 Code, as added by this Act. The coordinating board may adopt the 6 initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
