## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 431.001, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:
7	(1-a) "Servicemember" has the meaning assigned by
8	Section 161.551, Health and Safety Code.
9	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 431, Government Code, is
10	amended by adding Section 431.0291 to read as follows:
11	Sec. 431.0291. SERVICE REFERRAL PROGRAM. (a) The
12	department shall develop a program to provide referrals to
13	servicemembers for reintegration services.
14	(b) The program shall:
15	(1) identify and make referrals to community-based
16	organizations that have existing programs that provide
17	reintegration services to servicemembers and their families;
18	(2) focus on early intervention and appropriate
19	referral to promote the health of servicemembers and the children
20	and other family members of the servicemembers;
21	(3) promote family cohesion and sustainability;
22	(4) be based on evidence-based best practices related
23	to meeting the needs of servicemembers and the children and other
24	family members of the servicemembers;

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1	(5) be carried out, when appropriate, in a community
2	setting through peer counseling and other means effective for
3	<pre>community outreach;</pre>
4	(6) use existing service delivery facilities,
5	including churches, National Guard Bureau family education
6	facilities, and veterans centers and support facilities;
7	(7) use community-based and faith-based
8	organizations;
9	(8) be developed and administered in a manner that
10	promotes collaboration of service providers and results in the
11	referral of servicemembers, their children, and other family
12	members to the appropriate federal, state, and community services
13	for which they are eligible; and

3	SECTION 3. Section 434.007, Government Code, is amended to
4	read as follows:
5	Sec. 434.007. DUTIES. The commission shall:
6	(1) compile federal, state, and local laws enacted to
7	benefit members of the armed forces, veterans, and their families
8	and dependents;
9	(2) collect information relating to services and
10	facilities available to veterans;
11	(3) cooperate with veterans service agencies in the
12	state;
13	(4) inform members and veterans of the armed forces,
14	their families and dependents, and military and civilian
15	authorities about the existence or availability of:
16	(A) educational training and retraining
17	facilities;
18	(B) health, medical, rehabilitation, and housing
19	services and facilities;
20	(C) employment and reemployment services;
21	(D) provisions of federal, state, and local law
22	affording rights, privileges, and benefits to members and veterans
23	of the armed forces and their families and dependents; and
24	(E) other similar, related, or appropriate
25	matters;
26	(5) assist veterans and their families and dependents
27	in presenting, proving, and establishing claims, privileges,

1 rights, and benefits they may have under federal, state, or local
2 law;

3 (6) cooperate with all government and private agencies
4 securing services or benefits to veterans and their families and
5 dependents;

6 (7) investigate, and if possible correct, abuses or 7 exploitation of veterans or their families or dependents, and 8 recommend necessary legislation for full correction;

9 (8) coordinate the services and activities of state 10 departments and divisions having services and resources affecting 11 veterans or their families or dependents; [and]

12 (9) provide training and certification of veterans 13 county service officers and assistant veterans county service 14 officers in accordance with Section 434.038; and

15 (10) through surveys or other reasonable and accurate 16 methods of estimation, collect and maintain for each county in the 17 state the number of servicemembers and veterans residing in the 18 county and annually update and publish the information on the 19 commission's website.

20 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 434, Government Code, is 21 amended by adding Section 434.107 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 434.107. DIRECTORY OF SERVICES. (a) The commission</u> 23 <u>shall collaborate with and assist the Department of State Health</u> 24 <u>Services and the Health and Human Services Commission in compiling</u> 25 <u>and maintaining the directory of services established under Section</u> 26 <u>161.552, Health and Safety Code.</u>

27 (b) The commission shall provide the directory of services

2	commission's website or through links appearing on the commission's

4	SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 531.093 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 531.093. SERVICES FOR MILITARY PERSONNEL. (a) In
7	this section, "servicemember" has the meaning assigned by Section
8	161.551, Health and Safety Code.
9	(b) The executive commissioner shall ensure that each
10	health and human services agency adopts policies and procedures
11	that require the agency to:
12	(1) identify servicemembers who are seeking services
13	from the agency during the agency's intake and eligibility
14	determination process; and
15	(2) direct servicemembers seeking services to
16	appropriate service providers, including the United States
17	Veterans Health Administration, National Guard Bureau facilities,
18	and other federal, state, and local service providers.
19	(c) The executive commissioner shall make the directory of
20	resources established under Section 161.552, Health and Safety
21	Code, accessible to each health and human services agency.
22	SECTION 6. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
23	by adding Subchapter U to read as follows:
24	SUBCHAPTER U. INFORMATION REGARDING PROGRAMS FOR MILITARY
25	PERSONNEL AND THEIR FAMILIES
26	Sec. 161.551. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
27	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services

1	Commission.
2	(2) "Department" means the Department of State Health
3	Services.
4	(3) "Servicemember" means a resident of this state who
5	is a member or former member of the state military forces or a
6	component of the United States armed forces, including a reserve
7	component. In this section, "state military forces" has the
8	meaning assigned by Section 431.001, Government Code.
9	Sec. 161.552. DIRECTORY OF SERVICES. (a) The department
10	and commission shall compile, maintain, and disseminate through the
11	Texas Information and Referral Network and through other
12	appropriate media, a directory of services and other resources,
13	tools, and counseling programs available to servicemembers and
14	their immediate family.
15	(b) The directory must include:
16	(1) information regarding counseling services that:
17	(A) facilitate the reintegration of the
18	servicemember into civilian and family life;
19	(B) identify and treat stress disorders, trauma,
20	and traumatic brain injury;
21	(C) address parenting and family well-being,
22	employment, and substance abuse issues; and
23	(D) provide crisis intervention services;
24	(2) to the greatest degree possible in the judgment of
25	the department, all private and public community, state, and
26	national resources that protect and promote the health and
27	well-being of servicemembers and their immediate family and that

1	are accessible in the state directly or through electronic media,
2	print media, or the Internet; and
3	(3) other resources that support the health of
4	servicemembers and their families.
5	(c) The department and commission shall organize the
6	directory in a manner that allows a person to locate services in a
7	specific community in the state.
8	(d) The department and commission shall develop and
9	maintain the directory in collaboration with local, state, and
10	national private and government organizations, including:
11	(1) the United States Veterans Health Administration;
12	(2) the United States Department of Defense;
13	(3) the adjutant general's department;
14	(4) the Texas Veterans Commission; and
15	(5) other public and private national and
16	community-based organizations that provide support to
17	servicemembers and their families.
18	(e) The department shall provide the directory to the Texas
19	Information and Referral Network of the commission in the time
20	periods and in the manner and format specified by the Texas
21	Information and Referral Network.
22	(f) The department shall provide the directory on the
23	department's website or through links appearing on the department's
24	website.
25	SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
