- (2) "Passenger" or "passenger ["Passenger] trips" means the number of all passenger boardings, including transfers, but excluding charter passengers and carpool and vanpool passengers whose trips are only coordinated by the authority.
- (4) "Revenue vehicle" means a vehicle, or a combination of rail vehicles comprising a train, that is:
 - (A) used to carry paying passengers; and
 - (B) operated by an authority or as a purchased

service.
