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AN ACT

2 relating to the Texas Rural Foundation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Chapter 110, Health and Safety Code, is 5 transferred to Chapter 487, Government Code, is redesignated as 6 Subchapter P, Chapter 487, Government Code, and is amended to read 7 as follows:

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SUBCHAPTER P. TEXAS [CHAPTER 110.] RURAL FOUNDATION

Sec. 487.701 [110.001]. CREATION OF FOUNDATION. 9 (a) The Office of Rural Community Affairs shall establish the Texas Rural 10 Foundation as a nonprofit corporation that complies with the Texas 11 Non-Profit Corporation Act (Article 1396-1.01 et seq., Vernon's 12 13 Texas Civil Statutes), except as otherwise provided by this chapter, and qualifies as an organization exempt from federal 14 15 income tax under Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, 16 as amended.

17 (b) The Office of Rural Community Affairs shall ensure that 18 the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation operates independently of any state 19 agency or political subdivision of the state.

Sec. <u>487.702</u> [110.002]. POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall raise money from foundations, governmental entities, and other sources to finance health, community, and economic development programs in the rural areas of the state.

24 (b) The <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall have the powers that

1 are necessary and convenient to carry out its duties.

(c) The <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall develop and implement
policies and procedures that clearly separate the responsibilities
and activities of the foundation from the Office of Rural Community
Affairs.

6 Sec. <u>487.703</u> [110.003]. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. (a) The <u>Texas</u> 7 Rural Foundation is governed by a board of <u>an odd number of at least</u> 8 <u>nine and not more than 15</u> [five] directors appointed by the 9 executive committee of the Office of Rural Community Affairs [from 10 <u>individuals recommended by the executive director of the Office of</u> 11 <u>Rural Community Affairs</u>].

(b) Members of the board of directors of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation serve for staggered terms of six years, with as near as possible to one-third of the members' terms expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year.

(c) Appointments to the board of directors of the <u>Texas</u>
Rural Foundation shall be made without regard to the race, color,
disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin of the
appointees.

(d) The board of directors of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall ensure that the foundation remains eligible for an exemption from federal income tax under Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, by being listed as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of that code, as amended.

25 Sec. <u>487.704</u> [110.004]. RESTRICTIONS ON BOARD APPOINTMENT, 26 MEMBERSHIP, AND EMPLOYMENT. (a) In this section, "Texas trade 27 association" means a cooperative and voluntarily joined

1 association of business or professional competitors in this state 2 designed to assist its members and its industry or profession in 3 dealing with mutual business or professional problems and in 4 promoting their common interest.

5 (b) A person may not be a member of the board of directors of 6 the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation and may not be a foundation employee 7 employed in a "bona fide executive, administrative, or professional 8 capacity," as that phrase is used for purposes of establishing an 9 exemption to the overtime provisions of the federal Fair Labor 10 Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), as amended, 11 if:

(1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a Texas trade association that is in the field of health care or that contracts with the foundation; or

15 (2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid 16 consultant of a Texas trade association that is in the field of 17 health care or that contracts with the foundation.

18 (c) A person may not be a member of the board of directors of 19 the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation or act as the general counsel to the 20 board of directors or the foundation if the person is required to 21 register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305, Government Code, because 22 of the person's activities for compensation on behalf of a 23 profession related to the operation of the foundation.

Sec. <u>487.705</u> [110.005]. REMOVAL OF BOARD MEMBER. (a) It is a ground for removal from the board of directors of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation that a member:

27 (1) is ineligible for membership under Section

1 110.004;

2 (2) cannot, because of illness or disability,
3 discharge the member's duties for a substantial part of the member's
4 term; or

5 (3) is absent from more than half of the regularly 6 scheduled board meetings that the member is eligible to attend 7 during a calendar year without an excuse approved by a majority vote 8 of the board of directors.

9 (b) The validity of an action of the board of directors of 10 the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation is not affected by the fact that it is 11 taken when a ground for removal of a board member exists.

(c) If the executive director of the Office of Rural 12 Community Affairs has knowledge that a potential ground for removal 13 exists, the executive director shall notify the presiding officer 14 15 of the board of directors of the Texas Rural Foundation of the 16 potential ground. The presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a potential ground for 17 18 removal exists. If the potential ground for removal involves the presiding officer, the executive director shall notify the next 19 highest ranking officer of the board of directors, who shall then 20 notify the governor and the attorney general that a potential 21 ground for removal exists. 22

Sec. <u>487.706</u> [110.006]. VACANCY. A vacancy on the board of directors of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

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Sec. <u>487.707</u> [110.007]. OFFICERS. The board of directors

of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall elect from among its members a presiding officer, an assistant presiding officer, and other officers the board considers necessary. The presiding officer and assistant presiding officer serve for a period of one year and may be reelected.

6 Sec. <u>487.708</u> [110.008]. MEETINGS. The board of directors 7 of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation may meet as often as necessary, but 8 shall meet at least twice a year.

9 Sec. <u>487.709</u> [110.009]. TAX EXEMPTION. All income, 10 property, and other assets of the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation are exempt 11 from taxation by the state and political subdivisions of the state.

Sec. <u>487.710</u> [110.010]. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation and the Office of Rural Community Affairs shall enter into a memorandum of understanding that:

(1) requires the board of directors and staff of the foundation to report to the executive director and executive committee of the Office of Rural Community Affairs;

18 (2) allows the Office of Rural Community Affairs to19 provide staff functions to the foundation;

(3) allows the Office of Rural Community Affairs toexpend funds on the foundation; and

(4) outlines the financial contributions to be made tothe foundation from funds obtained from grants and other sources.

24 Sec. <u>487.711</u> [110.011]. RECORDS. (a) The <u>Texas</u> Rural 25 Foundation shall maintain financial records and reports 26 independently from those of the Office of Rural Community Affairs.

(b) The <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall comply with all filing

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requirements of the secretary of state and the Internal Revenue
 Service.

3 Sec. <u>487.712</u> [<u>110.012</u>]. REPORT TO OFFICE OF RURAL COMMUNITY 4 AFFAIRS. Not later than the 60th day after the last day of the 5 fiscal year, the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation shall submit to the Office 6 of Rural Community Affairs a report itemizing all income and 7 expenditures and describing all activities of the foundation during 8 the preceding fiscal year.

9 Sec. <u>487.713</u> [110.013]. PROHIBITED USE OF FUNDS. Funds 10 administered by the <u>Texas</u> Rural Foundation may not be used to 11 provide an abortion or a referral for an abortion, unless there is a 12 medically necessary reason to provide the referral.

13 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 487.056, Government 14 Code, is amended to read as follows:

15 (a) Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the 16 office shall submit a biennial report to the legislature regarding 17 the activities of the office, the activities of the <u>Texas</u> Rural 18 Foundation, and any findings and recommendations relating to rural 19 issues.

20 SECTION 3. (a) The name of the Rural Foundation is changed 21 to the Texas Rural Foundation.

(b) Any reference in law to the Rural Foundation means theTexas Rural Foundation.

SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the executive committee of the Office of Rural Community Affairs shall appoint the additional members of the board of directors of the Texas Rural Foundation as provided by Section

1 487.703, Government Code, as added by this Act. In making the 2 appointments, the executive committee shall assign the lengths of 3 the terms of the additional members to meet the staggered six-year 4 term requirement under Subsection (b), Section 487.703, Government 5 Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
