A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the calculation of certain fees collected to defrag
3	certain expenses incurred in conjunction with the sale of a motor
4	vehicle.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 348.006, Finance Code, is amended by
7	amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (e), (f)
8	and (g) to read as follows:
9	(a) The principal balance under a retail installment
10	contract is computed by:
11	(1) adding:
12	(A) the cash price of the motor vehicle;
13	(B) each amount included in the retail
14	installment contract for an itemized charge; and
15	(C) subject to Subsection (c), a documentary fee
16	for services rendered for or on behalf of the retail buyer in
17	$[rac{ ext{preparing}_{m{ au}}}{ ext{n}}]$ handling $[m{ au}]$ and processing documents associated with
18	the titling, registration, and licensing of a [relating to the]
19	motor vehicle and to the closing of the <u>sale</u> [retail installment
20	<pre>transaction]; and</pre>
21	(2) subtracting from the results under Subdivision (1)
22	the amount of the retail buyer's down payment in money, goods, or
23	both.

(c) For a documentary fee to be included in the principal

- balance of a retail installment contract:
- 2 (1) the retail seller must charge the documentary fee
- 3 to cash buyers and credit buyers;
- 4 (2) the documentary fee may not exceed the greater of
- 5 \$75 or an amount computed under Subsections (e) and (f) [\$50] for a
- 6 motor vehicle retail installment contract or a reasonable amount
- 7 agreed to by the retail seller and retail buyer for a heavy
- 8 commercial vehicle retail installment contract; and
- 9 (3) the buyer's order and the retail installment
- 10 contract must include:
- 11 (A) a statement of the amount of the documentary
- 12 fee; and
- 13 (B) in reasonable proximity to the place in each
- 14 where the amount of the documentary fee is disclosed, the following
- 15 notice in type that is bold-faced, capitalized, underlined, or
- otherwise conspicuously set out from surrounding written material:
- "A DOCUMENTARY FEE IS NOT AN OFFICIAL FEE. A DOCUMENTARY FEE
- 18 IS NOT REQUIRED BY LAW, BUT MAY BE CHARGED TO BUYERS FOR HANDLING
- 19 AND PROCESSING DOCUMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE TITLING,
- 20 REGISTRATION, AND LICENSING OF A MOTOR VEHICLE AND [PERFORMING
- 21 $\frac{\text{SERVICES RELATING}}{\text{SERVICES RELATING}}$ TO THE CLOSING OF THE [A] SALE. THE MAXIMUM
- 22 <u>AMOUNT THAT MAY BE CHARGED FOR</u> A DOCUMENTARY FEE <u>IN A TRANSACTION</u>
- 23 <u>INVOLVING</u> [MAY NOT EXCEED \$50 FOR] A MOTOR VEHICLE OTHER THAN A
- 24 HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLE IS DETERMINED ACCORDING TO SECTION
- 25 348.006, FINANCE CODE. THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT THAT MAY BE CHARGED FOR A
- 26 DOCUMENTARY FEE IN A TRANSACTION INVOLVING A HEAVY COMMERCIAL
- 27 VEHICLE IS [CONTRACT OR] A REASONABLE AMOUNT AGREED TO BY THE

- 1 PARTIES [FOR A HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLE CONTRACT]. THIS NOTICE IS
- 2 REQUIRED BY LAW."
- 3 (e) The maximum documentary fee that may be charged in a
- 4 transaction involving a motor vehicle other than a heavy commercial
- 5 vehicle shall be adjusted annually, using a reference base amount
- of \$75. Each year the commissioner shall revise the maximum amount
- 7 allowed for a documentary fee by:
- 8 <u>(1) dividing the reference base index into the</u>
- 9 consumer price index at the end of the preceding year;
- 10 (2) computing the percentage of change under
- 11 Subdivision (1) to the nearest whole percent;
- 12 (3) multiplying the reference amount of \$75 by the
- 13 result obtained under Subdivision (2); and
- 14 (4) rounding the result obtained under Subdivision (3)
- 15 to the nearest \$5 increment.
- (f) For purposes of a computation made under Subsection (e),
- 17 the consumer price index is the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage
- 18 Earners and Clerical Workers: U.S. City Average, All Items,
- 19 1967=100, compiled by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States
- 20 Department of Labor, or, if that index is canceled or superseded,
- 21 the index chosen by the Bureau of Labor Statistics as most
- 22 accurately reflecting the changes in the purchasing power of the
- 23 dollar for consumers. The reference base index is the consumer
- 24 price index for December 2006. The revised ceiling amount provided
- 25 by Subsection (e) takes effect on July 1 of the year of its
- 26 computation.
- 27 (g) The commissioner shall publish the maximum amount that

- 1 may be charged for a documentary fee computed under Subsections (e)
- 2 and (f) in a manner designed to provide notice of the rate to all
- 3 affected parties.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
