## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-9 relating to the filing of a complaint or referral to juvenile court 1-10 by a school district against a student for failing to attend school. 1-11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-12 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 25.0951, Education Code, 1-13 is amended to read as follows:

1-14 (a) If a student fails to attend school without excuse on 10 1-15 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same 1-16 school year, a school district shall within <u>10</u> [seven] school days 1-17 of the student's last absence:

1-18 (1) file a complaint against the student or the 1-19 student's parent or both in a county, justice, or municipal court 1-20 for an offense under Section 25.093 or 25.094, as appropriate, or 1-21 refer the student to a juvenile court in a county with a population 1-22 of less than 100,000 for conduct that violates Section 25.094; or

1-23 (2) refer the student to a juvenile court for conduct 1-24 indicating a need for supervision under Section 51.03(b)(2), Family 1-25 Code.

1-26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-28 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-29 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-30 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
