A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to inclusion in the immunization registry of immunization 3 records of first responders and their immediate family members and of immunization records obtained during certain 4 declared 5 disasters. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 161.0001, Health and Safety Code, is 7 amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivisions (1-a) 8 and (1-b) to read as follows: 9 (1) "Data elements" means the information: 10 11 (A) a health care provider who administers a 12 vaccine is required to record in a medical record under 42 U.S.C. Section 300aa-25, as amended, including: 13 14 (i) [(A)] the date the vaccine is administered; 15 16 (ii) [(B)] the vaccine manufacturer and lot number of the vaccine; 17 18 (iii) any adverse or unexpected events for a vaccine; and 19 (iv) [(C)] the name, the address, and if 20 21 appropriate, the title of the health care provider administering 22 the vaccine; and 23 (B) specified in rules adopted to implement 24 Section 161.00705.

6	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Sections 161.00705, 161.00706, and

3	Sec. 161.00706. FIRST RESPONDER IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION.
4	(a) A person 18 years of age or older who is a first responder or an
5	immediate family member of a first responder may:

8 (2) inform a parent, managing conservator, or guardian
9 of each patient younger than 18 years of age about the registry;

10 (3) require the written consent of a parent, managing 11 conservator, or guardian of a patient <u>younger than 18 years of age</u> 12 before any information relating to the patient is included in the 13 registry; [and]

14 (4) permit a parent, managing conservator, or guardian
 15 <u>of a patient younger than 18 years of age</u> to withdraw consent for

(b) The [childhood] immunization registry must contain information on the immunization history that is obtained by the department under:

5 <u>(b-1)</u> The department shall remove from the registry 6 information for any person for whom consent has been withdrawn. The 7 department may not retain individually identifiable information 8 about any person:

(1) for whom consent has been withdrawn;

10 (2) for whom a consent for continued inclusion in the 11 registry following the end of the disaster or public health 12 emergency has not been received under Section 161.00705(f); or

13 (3) for whom a request to be removed from the registry 14 has been received under Section 161.00706(e).

15 (b-2) Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter, the 16 department shall retain the information in the registry until the 17 person's death. Not later than the 180th day after the date a 18 person whose immunization information is included in the registry 19 turns 18 years of age, the department shall notify the person that 20 the information will remain in the registry unless the person 21 withdraws consent to be included in the registry.

(j) Except as provided by <u>Sections 161.00705, 161.00706,</u> and [Section] 161.008, information obtained by the department for the immunization registry is confidential and may be disclosed only with the written consent of <u>the individual or, if a child</u>, the child's parent, managing conservator, or guardian.

27 SECTION 4. Subsections (a) and (c), Section 161.0073,

1 Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by Section 161.00705, [The]
information that individually identifies a child or other
<u>individual that is</u> received by the department for the immunization
registry is confidential and may be used by the department for
registry purposes only.

7 (C) A person required to report information to the 8 department for registry purposes or authorized to receive 9 information from the registry may not disclose the individually identifiable information of a child or other individual to any 10 other person without written consent of the individual or, if a 11 child, the parent, managing conservator, or guardian of the child, 12 except as provided by Chapter 159, Occupations Code, or Section 13 14 602.053, Insurance Code.

15 SECTION 5. Section 161.0075, Health and Safety Code, is 16 amended to read as follows:

FROM 17 Sec. 161.0075. IMMUNITY LIABILITY. Except as provided by Section 161.009, the following persons subject to this 18 subchapter that act in compliance with Sections 161.007, 161.00705, 19 161.00706, 161.0071, 161.0073, 161.0074, and 161.008 are not 20 21 civilly or criminally liable for furnishing the information required under this subchapter: 22

23 (1) a payor;

24 (2) a health care provider who administers25 immunizations; and

26 (3) an employee of the department.
 27 SECTION 6. Subsection (a), Section 161.009, Health and

1 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A person commits an offense if the person:

3 (1) negligently releases or discloses immunization 4 registry information in violation of Section 161.007, 161.0071, 5 161.0073, or 161.008;

6 (2) fails to exclude a child's immunization 7 information in violation of Section 161.0071; [or]

8 (3) <u>fails to remove a person's immunization</u>
9 <u>information in violation of Section 161.00705 or 161.00706; or</u>

10 <u>(4)</u> negligently uses information in the immunization 11 registry to solicit new patients or clients or for other purposes 12 that are not associated with immunization or quality-of-care 13 purposes, unless authorized under this section.

SECTION 7. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0102 to read as follows:

Sec. 161.0102. DISASTER PREPARATION. The department shall consult with public health departments and appropriate health care providers to identify adult immunizations that may be necessary to respond to or prepare for a disaster or public health emergency.

20 SECTION 8. Subsection (a), Section 161.0105, Health and 21 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A health care provider who acts in compliance with
Sections 161.007, 161.00705, 161.00706, and 161.008 and any rules
adopted under those sections is not civilly or criminally liable
for furnishing the information required under those sections. This
subsection does not apply to criminal liability established under
Section 161.009.

1 SECTION 9. As soon as practicable after the effective date 2 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 3 Services Commission shall adopt the rules required under Sections 4 161.00705 and 161.00706, Health and Safety Code, as added by this 5 Act.

6 SECTION 10. The change in law made by this Act to Section 161.009, Health and Safety Code, applies only to an offense 7 8 committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is covered by the 9 law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is 10 continued in effect for that purpose. For the purposes of this 11 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this 12 Act if any element of the offense was committed before that date. 13 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007. 14
