A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a commission on state government
3	spending to address waste, fraud, and abuse in state agency
4	operations.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 2060 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 2060. COMMISSION ON STATE GOVERNMENT SPENDING
9	Sec. 2060.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "state agency"
10	means any department, commission, board, office, or other agency
11	<pre>that:</pre>
12	(1) is in the executive branch of state government;
13	(2) has authority that is not limited to a
14	geographical portion of the state; and
15	(3) was created by the constitution or a statute of
16	this state.
17	Sec. 2060.002. COMMISSION COMPOSITION. (a) The Commission
18	on State Government Spending is composed of a number of members
19	determined and selected in equal numbers by the governor,
20	lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives.
21	(b) A member of the commission must have the qualifications
22	determined by the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
23	house of representatives and may not be currently serving as a

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member of the house of representatives or senate.

- 1 (c) A member of the commission serves at the will of the
- 2 appointing authority.
- 3 Sec. 2060.003. OFFICERS; COMPENSATION; MEETINGS. (a) The
- 4 governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of
- 5 representatives shall jointly designate a presiding officer from
- 6 among the members of the commission. The commission may elect other
- 7 officers from its members as the commission considers appropriate.
- 8 (b) A member of the commission may not receive compensation
- 9 for service on the commission.
- 10 (c) The commission shall meet at the call of the presiding
- officer or the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
- 12 house of representatives.
- Sec. 2060.004. DUTIES. The commission shall:
- 14 (1) conduct audits and in-depth reviews of the
- operations of state agencies to identify waste, fraud, or abuse
- 16 <u>occurring in state agency operations;</u>
- 17 (2) investigate and study cases reported to the
- 18 commission of suspected waste, fraud, and abuse in state agency
- 19 operations; and
- 20 (3) prepare a list of substantive recommendations to
- 21 reduce or eliminate waste, fraud, and abuse in state agency
- 22 operations.
- Sec. 2060.005. AGENCY COOPERATION. The administrative head
- 24 of a state agency shall provide to the commission information
- 25 requested by the commission in performing its duties under this
- 26 chapter.
- Sec. 2060.006. REPORT AND LIST OF RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) Not

- 1 later than January 1, 2009, the commission shall present to the
- 2 governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of
- 3 representatives:
- 4 (1) a report on the results of the investigation and
- 5 study conducted under this chapter; and
- 6 (2) a substantive list of recommendations for reducing
- 7 or eliminating waste, fraud, and abuse in state agency operations.
- 8 (b) The 81st Legislature in Regular Session shall introduce
- 9 the commission's unaltered recommendations as a bill and shall
- 10 accept or reject but may not amend the list of substantive
- 11 recommendations by record vote.
- 12 Sec. 2060.007. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110
- does not apply to the commission.
- 14 Sec. 2060.008. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September
- 15 1, 2009.
- 16 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- of this Act, the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
- 18 house of representatives shall appoint members to the Commission on
- 19 State Government Spending as required under Chapter 2060,
- 20 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
