## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the civil commitment of sexually violent predators.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 841.002, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by amending Subdivisions (1) and (5) and adding Subdivision
6	(3-a) to read as follows:
7	(1) "Attorney representing the state" means an
8	attorney employed by the civil division of the special [prison]
9	prosecution unit to initiate and pursue a civil commitment
10	proceeding under this chapter.
11	(3-a) "Civil commitment proceeding" means a trial or
12	hearing conducted under Subchapter D, F, or G.
13	(5) "Predatory act" means an act [that is committed
14	for the purpose of victimization and that is] directed toward
15	individuals, including family members, [÷
16	[ <del>(A) a stranger;</del>
17	(B) a person of casual acquaintance with whom no
18	substantial relationship exists; or
19	(C) a person with whom a relationship has been
20	established or promoted] for the primary purpose of victimization.
21	SECTION 2. Section 841.004, Health and Safety Code, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Sec. 841.004. SPECIAL [PRISON] PROSECUTION UNIT. The civil

 $[\underline{A} \ special]$  division of the  $\underline{special}$   $[\underline{prison}]$  prosecution unit,

- 1 separate from that part of the unit responsible for prosecuting
- 2 criminal cases, is responsible for initiating and pursuing a civil
- 3 commitment proceeding under this chapter.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 841.061, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 6 (g) A judge assigned to preside over a trial under this
- 7 subchapter is not subject to an objection under Section 74.053,
- 8 Government Code, other than an objection made under Section
- 9 74.053(d), Government Code.
- 10 SECTION 4. Section 841.085, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 841.085. CRIMINAL PENALTY; PROSECUTION OF OFFENSE.
- 13 (a) A person commits an offense if, after having been adjudicated
- 14 and civilly committed as a sexually violent predator under this
- chapter, the person violates a civil commitment requirement imposed
- 16 under Section 841.082.
- 17 <u>(b)</u> An offense under this section is a felony of the third
- 18 degree.
- 19 (c) At the request of the local prosecuting attorney, an
- 20 attorney employed by the civil division of the special prosecution
- 21 unit described by Section 841.004 may assist in the trial of an
- 22 offense under this section.
- SECTION 5. Section 841.147, Health and Safety Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 841.147. IMMUNITY. The following persons are immune
- 26 from liability for good faith conduct under this chapter:
- 27 (1) an employee or officer of the Texas Department of

- 1 Criminal Justice, the [Texas] Department of State Health Services
- 2 [Mental Health and Mental Retardation], the Department of Aging and
- 3 Disability Services [Texas Department of Health], or the council;
- 4 (2) a member of the multidisciplinary team established
- 5 under Section 841.022;
- 6 (3) an employee of the  $\underline{\text{civil}}$  division of the  $\underline{\text{special}}$
- 7 [prison] prosecution unit charged with initiating and pursuing
- 8 civil commitment proceedings under this chapter; and
- 9 (4) a person providing, or contracting, appointed, or
- 10 volunteering to perform, a tracking service or another service
- 11 under this chapter.
- 12 SECTION 6. Chapter 13, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- amended by adding Article 13.315 to read as follows:
- 14 Art. 13.315. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SEXUALLY VIOLENT
- 15 PREDATOR CIVIL COMMITMENT REQUIREMENT. An offense under Section
- 16 841.085, Health and Safety Code, may be prosecuted in the county in
- which any element of the offense occurs or in Montgomery County.
- SECTION 7. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 19 this section, the change in law made by this Act applies only to an
- 20 individual who on or after September 1, 2007, is serving a sentence
- 21 in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or is committed to the
- 22 Department of State Health Services or the Department of Aging and
- 23 Disability Services for an offense committed before, on, or after
- 24 the effective date of this Act.
- (b) The change in law made by this Act in adding Subsection
- 26 (g), Section 841.061, Health and Safety Code, applies to a petition
- 27 alleging predator status that is filed on or after the effective

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- 1 date of this Act.
- 2 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007, except
- 3 that Section 3 of this Act takes effect immediately if this Act
- 4 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 5 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 6 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 7 effect, Section 3 takes effect September 1, 2007.
