19	SECTION 3. Section 841.085, Health and Safety Code, is

22	(a) A person commits an offense if , after having been adjudicated
23	and civilly committed as a sexually violent predator under this

2 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the third
3 degree.

4 (c) At the request of the local prosecuting attorney, an
5 attorney employed by the special division of the prison prosecution
6 unit described by Section 841.004 may assist in the trial of an
7 offense under this section.

8 SECTION 4. Section 841.147, Health and Safety Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 841.147. IMMUNITY. The following persons are immune from liability for good faith conduct under this chapter:

(1) an employee or officer of the Texas Department of
Criminal Justice, the [Texas] Department of <u>State Health Services</u>
[Mental Health and Mental Retardation], the <u>Department of Aging and</u>
<u>Disability Services</u> [Texas Department of Health], or the council;

16 (2) a member of the multidisciplinary team established 17 under Section 841.022;

(3) an employee of the <u>special</u> division of the prison
prosecution unit charged with initiating and pursuing civil
commitment proceedings under this chapter; and

(4) a person providing, or contracting, appointed, or
volunteering to perform, a tracking service or another service
under this chapter.

24 SECTION 5. Chapter 13, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 25 amended by adding Article 13.315 to read as follows:

26Art. 13.315. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SEXUALLY VIOLENT27PREDATOR CIVIL COMMITMENT REQUIREMENT. An offense under Section

## 841.085, Health and Safety Code, may be prosecuted in the county in which any element of the offense occurs or in Montgomery County.

3 SECTION 6. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this 4 section, the change in law made by this Act applies only to an 5 individual who on or after September 1, 2007, is serving a sentence 6 in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or is committed to the 7 Department of State Health Services or the Department of Aging and 8 Disability Services for an offense committed before, on, or after 9 the effective date of this Act.

10 (b) The change in law made by this Act in adding Section 11 841.061(g), Health and Safety Code, applies to a petition alleging 12 predator status that is filed on or after the effective date of this 13 Act.

SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007, except that Section 2 of this Act takes effect immediately if this Act receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, Section 2 takes effect September 1, 2007.
