	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to establishment of a pilot program by the commissioner of
3	education for the prevention of obesity in children attending the
4	public schools.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 38.020 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 38.020. OBESITY PREVENTION PILOT PROGRAM. (a) Using
9	funds appropriated for that purpose, the commissioner by rule shall
10	establish a pilot program involving activities in the public
11	schools designed to:
12	(1) decrease the rate of obesity in children attending
13	<pre>public schools;</pre>
14	(2) improve nutritional choices by children;
15	(3) increase the academic performance of children who
16	are obese or are at risk of obesity; and
17	(4) achieve reductions in the costs incurred by the
18	state as a result of children's obesity.
19	(b) The commissioner shall implement the pilot program in
20	three geographic regions of this state, as selected by the
21	commissioner. In selecting the regions for participation, the
22	commissioner shall consider at least the following factors:
23	(1) the degree to which children in the region are at
24	higher than average risk of developing diabetes, as indicated by

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1	state health care information or other relevant indicators;
2	(2) the degree to which the performance of children in
3	the region on the assessment instruments required by Section 39.023
4	are lower than the statewide average performance of children on
5	those assessment instruments; and
6	(3) whether more than one-third of the student
7	population in the region is educationally disadvantaged.
8	(c) The commissioner shall request proposals for services
9	to be provided under the pilot program from private or public
10	entities. In selecting entities to provide services, the
11	commissioner shall consider:
12	(1) the proven experience of a potential provider in
13	providing high-quality, cost-effective programs relating to health
14	education, physical education, physical activity, nutrition, or
15	family involvement; and
16	(2) the demonstrated expertise of a potential provider
17	in youth culture and youth media.
18	(d) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
19	implement the pilot program.
20	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
21	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
22	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
23	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
24	Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
