(a) The legal notice of the intention to 13 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 14 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 15 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 16 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 17 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 18 Government Code.

(b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
Environmental Quality.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 22 (c)its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 23 24 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives within the required time. 25

26 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this27 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
