2	relating to permits and licenses issued by the Texas Alcoholic
3	Beverage Commission.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 5.50, Alcoholic Beverage
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	(b) The commission may not increase or decrease a fee set by
8	this code, but if a statute is enacted creating a certificate,
9	permit, or license and there is no fee established, the commission
10	by rule may set a fee. The commission by rule shall assess [and
11	collect annual] surcharges <u>on</u> [from] all <u>applicants for an original</u>
12	<u>or renewal</u> [holders of a] certificate, permit, or license issued by
13	the commission in addition to any fee set by this code <u>and collect</u>
14	the surcharges at the time of application. In assessing a
15	surcharge, the commission may not overly penalize any segment of
16	the alcoholic beverage industry or impose an undue hardship on
17	small businesses.
18	SECTION 2. Subsection (c), Section 6.02, Alcoholic Beverage
19	Code, is amended to read as follows:
20	(c) The commission may not abate or refund a license or
21	permit fee because of a change in the expiration date made under
22	this section but may authorize a license or permit period of less
23	than one year for the period during which the expiration date is

changed. The commission may not authorize a license or permit

1

period of greater than two years [one year].

SECTION 3. Section 11.09, Alcoholic Beverage Code, 2 is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections 3 4 (d) and (e) to read as follows:

5 (a) A permit issued under this code expires on the second anniversary of [one year after] the date it is issued, except as 6 7 [otherwise] provided by <u>Subsections (d) and (e) or another</u> provision of this code. Notwithstanding Section 5.50(b), the 8 9 commission shall double the amount of fees and surcharges otherwise applicable under this code for a permit with a two-year term. 10

A secondary permit which requires the holder of the 11 (b) permit to first obtain another permit, including a late hours 12 permit or temporary permit, expires on the same date the basic or 13 primary permit expires. The commission may not prorate or refund 14 15 any part of the fee for the secondary permit if the application of 16 this section results in the expiration of the permit in less than two years [one year]. 17

18 (d) The commission by rule may require that the expiration date for an individual permit holder's permit is the first 19 20 anniversary of the date on which the permit is issued due to the permit holder's violation history. 21

22 (e) The commission may issue a permit with an expiration date less than two years after the date the permit is issued in 23 order to maintain a reasonable annual distribution of renewal 24 25 application review work and permit fees. If the commission issues a permit with an expiration date less than two years after the date 26 27 the permit is issued, the commission shall prorate the permit fee on

a monthly basis so that the permit holder pays only that portion of 1 the permit fee that is allocable to the number of months during 2 3 which the permit is valid. SECTION 4. Subsection (d), 4 Section 28.04, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 This section does not apply to a change in corporate (d) 7 control: brought about by the death of a shareholder if the (1)8 9 shareholder's [his] surviving spouse or descendants are the 10 shareholder's [his] successors in interest; or brought about when legal or beneficial ownership 11 (2) of over 50 percent of the stock of the corporation has been 12 transferred: 13 to a person who possesses the qualifications 14 (A) 15 required of other applicants for permits and is currently an 16 officer of the corporation and has been an officer of the corporation ever since the date the original permit was issued; or 17 18 (B) if the permittee [pays a fee of \$500 and] notifies the commission, on completed forms and attachments 19 prescribed by the commission, of the proposed transfer [at least 10 20 days] prior to the date the transfer is to become effective and the 21 commission does not find that circumstances exist that would be 22 grounds for the denial of a renewal of the permit under Section 23 11.46 [of this code] and provided the ownership of the corporation 24 25 immediately after the transfer satisfies the requirements of this code. 26 SECTION 5. Section 61.03, Alcoholic Beverage Code, 27 is

1 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections 2 (d) and (e) to read as follows: Except as provided by Subsections (d) and (e) or another 3 (a) provision of this code, any [Subsection (b), a license may not be 4 5 issued for a term longer than one year. Any] license except a branch, importer's, importer's carrier's, or temporary license 6 7 expires on the second anniversary of [one year after] the date on which it is issued. Notwithstanding Section 5.50(b), the 8 9 commission shall require double the amount of fees and surcharges otherwise applicable under this code for a license with a two-year 10 11 term.

(b) A secondary license which requires the holder of the license to first obtain another license, including a late hours license or temporary license, expires on the same date the basic or primary license expires. The commission may not prorate or refund any part of the fee for the secondary license if the application of this section results in the expiration of the license in less than two years [one year].

19 (d) The commission by rule may require that the expiration 20 date for an individual license holder's license is the first 21 anniversary of the date on which the license is issued due to the 22 license holder's violation history.

23 (e) The commission may issue a license with an expiration 24 date less than two years after the date the license is issued in 25 order to maintain a reasonable annual distribution of renewal 26 application review work and license fees. If the commission issues 27 a license with an expiration date less than two years after the date

1	the license is issued, the commission shall prorate the license fee
2	on a monthly basis so that the license holder pays only that portion
3	of the license fee that is allocable to the number of months during
4	which the license is valid.
5	SECTION 6. Section 11.40, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
6	repealed.

7 SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act to Section 8 28.04, Alcoholic Beverage Code, applies to renewal of a mixed 9 beverage permit that expires on or after the effective date of this 10 Act, regardless of when legal or beneficial ownership of the 11 corporation holding the permit changed.

SECTION 8. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, the changes in law made by this Act apply only to a license or permit issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A license or permit issued or renewed before the effective date of this Act expires on its own terms and is governed by the law in effect when the license or permit was issued or renewed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
