- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 521.126, Transportation Code, is amended
- by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) 8
- to read as follows: 9
- 10 Except as provided by Subsections (d), (e), and (g), a
- person commits an offense if the person: 11
- 12 (1) accesses or uses electronically
- information derived from a driver's license, commercial driver's 13
- license, or personal identification certificate without the 14
- consent of the license or certificate holder; or 15
- (2) compiles or maintains a database of electronically 16
- readable information derived from driver's licenses, commercial 17
- driver's licenses, or personal identification certificates without 18
- 19 the consent of each license or certificate holder whose information
- is compiled or maintained. 20
- (b-1) For the purposes of Subsection (b), a license or 21
- 22 certificate holder provides consent only by signing a separate
- document or using an electronic signature, as defined by Section 23
- 24 43.002, Business & Commerce Code, on an electronic record that

- 1 states:
- 2 <u>"I consent to allow (insert name of person) to access or</u>
- 3 include information from my driver's license or personal
- 4 identification certificate in a compilation or database."
- 5 (b-2) A person may not sell or otherwise disclose
- 6 electronically readable information accessed, compiled, or
- 7 described by Subsection (b) to another person or an affiliate of the
- 8 person. This subsection does not apply to a financial institution
- 9 described by Subsection (e).
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 12 Act. For the purposes of this section, an offense is committed
- 13 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 14 occurs before that date.
- 15 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 16 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 17 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
