5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 104.003, Occupations Code, is amended by
7	amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsection (f-1) to read as
8	follows:
9	(f) A person who is licensed by the Texas Optometry Board <u>as</u>
10	an optometrist shall use:

12	<pre>(2) doctor, optometrist;</pre>
13	(3) doctor of optometry; [or]

15	<u>(5)</u> O.D.
16	(f-1) A person who is licensed by the Texas Optometry Board
17	as a therapeutic optometrist shall use a designation approved by
18	the board.
19	SECTION 2. Section 351.002(8), Occupations Code, is amended
20	to read as follows:
21	(8) "Surgery" means a procedure using instruments,
22	including lasers, scalpels, or needles, in which human tissue is
23	cut, burned, vaporized, or otherwise altered by any mechanical
24	means, laser, or ionizing radiation. The term includes procedures

The term does not include: 3 (A) using a noninvasive procedure to remove a superficial foreign body in the conjunctiva, eyelid, or corneal 4 5 epithelium that has not perforated the Bowman's membrane; 6 (B) using tissue glue to close a wound; 7 (C) performing cultures or smears for diagnosis; 8 (D) pulling eyelashes; 9 (E) dilating, irrigating, or probing the 10 lacrimal passages; 11 (F) placing punctal plugs; 12 (G) removing loose epithelium to promote 13 healing; 14 (H) draining an abscess; 15 (I) removing small bumps from the eyelid; 16 (J) draining a cyst; 17 (K) removing irregular eyelashes with 18 electrolysis; or 19 (L) closing the puncta by cautery. SECTION 3. Section 351.004, Occupations Code, is amended to 20 read as follows: 21 Sec. 351.004. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas Optometry Board 22 is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). 23 24 Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the 25 board is abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2015 $[\frac{2017}{2}]$. 26 27 SECTION 4. Section 351.358(b), Occupations Code, is amended

(b) A therapeutic optometrist may:

3 (1) [administer, perform, or prescribe ophthalmic 4 devices, procedures, and appropriate medications administered by 5 topical or oral means, in accordance with this section and Section 6 351.3581, to] diagnose and [or] treat [visual defects, abnormal] 7 conditions, [or] diseases, and disorders of the human vision 8 system, including the eye and adnexa, by any appropriate means 9 other than surgery; [or]

10 (2) administer <u>or prescribe any</u> medication by <u>any</u> 11 <u>route of administration that is appropriate for the diagnosis or</u> 12 <u>treatment of the eye, adnexa, or visual system, other than a</u> 13 <u>controlled substance listed in Schedule I or II as established by</u> 14 <u>the commissioner of state health services under Chapter 481, Health</u> 15 <u>and Safety Code; and</u>

16 (3) remove all or part of an eye from a dead human body 17 for transplant or scientific purposes [parenteral means for a 18 purpose and in a manner prescribed by Subsection (e)].

SECTION 5. Section 301.002(2), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

(2) "Professional nursing" means the performance of an act that requires substantial specialized judgment and skill, the proper performance of which is based on knowledge and application of the principles of biological, physical, and social science as acquired by a completed course in an approved school of professional nursing. The term does not include acts of medical diagnosis or the prescription of therapeutic or corrective

1 measures. Professional nursing involves:

(A) the observation, assessment, intervention,
evaluation, rehabilitation, care and counsel, or health teachings
of a person who is ill, injured, infirm, or experiencing a change in
normal health processes;

6 (B) the maintenance of health or prevention of 7 illness;

8 (C) the administration of a medication or
9 treatment as ordered by a physician, podiatrist, [or] dentist, or
10 <u>therapeutic optometrist</u>;

(D) the supervision or teaching of nursing;
 (E) the administration, supervision, and
 evaluation of nursing practices, policies, and procedures;

(F) the requesting, receiving, signing for, and distribution of prescription drug samples to patients at sites in which a registered nurse is authorized to sign prescription drug orders as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157;

18 (G) the performance of an act delegated by a
19 physician under Section 157.052, 157.053, 157.054, 157.0541,
20 157.0542, 157.058, or 157.059; and

(H) the development of the nursing care plan.
 SECTION 6. Section 453.001(9), Occupations Code, is amended
 to read as follows:

(9) "Referring practitioner" means a qualified
licensed health care professional who, within the scope of
professional licensure, may refer a person for health care
services. The term includes:

No. 1265 1 (A) a physician licensed to practice medicine by a state board of medical examiners; 2 3 (B) a dentist licensed by a state board of dental 4 examiners; 5 (C) a chiropractor licensed by a state board of 6 chiropractic examiners; [and] a podiatrist licensed by a state board of 7 (D) podiatric medical examiners; and 8 9 (E) an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist licensed by a state optometry board. 10 SECTION 7. Section 454.213(b), Occupations Code, is amended 11 to read as follows: 12 Implementation of direct occupational therapy to a 13 (b) 14 person for a specific health care condition must be based on a 15 referral from: (1) a physician licensed by a state board of medical 16 17 examiners; a dentist licensed by a state board of dental (2) 18 examiners; 19 20 (3) a chiropractor licensed by a state board of 21 chiropractic examiners; 22 (4) a podiatrist licensed by a state board of 23 podiatric medical examiners; [or] 24 (5) an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist 25 licensed by a state optometry board; or 26 (6) another qualified, licensed health care professional who is authorized to refer for health care services 27

1 within the scope of the professional's license.

2 SECTION 8. The changes in law made by this Act do not 3 prohibit a therapeutic optometrist from performing a procedure or 4 administering or prescribing a medication that the therapeutic 5 optometrist could perform, administer, or prescribe immediately 6 before the effective date of this Act.
