## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:					
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by					
5	adding Subchapter M to read as follows:					
6	SUBCHAPTER M. SILVER ALERT FOR MISSING SENIOR CITIZENS					
7	Sec. 411.381. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:					
8	(1) "Alert" means the statewide silver alert for					
9	missing senior citizens developed and implemented under this					
10	subchapter.					
11	(2) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law					
12	enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of a					
13	missing senior citizen.					
14	(3) "Senior citizen" means a person who is 65 years o					
15	age or older.					
16	Sec. 411.382. SILVER ALERT FOR MISSING SENIOR CITIZENS					
17	With the cooperation of the Texas Department of Transportation, the					
18	office of the governor, and other appropriate law enforcement					
19	agencies in this state, the department shall develop and implemen-					
20	a statewide silver alert to be activated on behalf of a missing					
21	senior citizen.					
22	Sec. 411.383. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The director is the					
23	statewide coordinator of the alert.

(b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as

- 1 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules
- 2 <u>and directives must include:</u>
- 3 (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 4 enforcement agency to verify whether a senior citizen:
- 5 (A) is missing; and
- 6 (B) has an impaired mental condition;
- 7 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 8 <u>local law enforcement agency is required to report a missing senior</u>
- 9 citizen to the department; and
- 10 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 11 entity to report information about a missing senior citizen to
- 12 designated media outlets in Texas.
- Sec. 411.384. DEPARTMENT TO RECRUIT PARTICIPANTS. The
- department shall recruit public and commercial television and radio
- 15 broadcasters, private commercial entities, state or local
- 16 governmental entities, the public, and other appropriate persons to
- 17 assist in developing and implementing the alert.
- 18 Sec. 411.385. DUTIES OF TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.
- 19 The Texas Department of Transportation shall:
- 20 (1) cooperate with the department and assist in
- 21 developing and implementing the alert; and
- (2) establish a plan for providing relevant
- 23 information to the public through an existing system of dynamic
- 24 message signs located across the state.
- Sec. 411.386. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING SENIOR
- 26 CITIZEN. (a) A local law enforcement agency may notify the
- 27 department if the agency:

16	citizen's impaired mental condition to verify the condition as				
17	required by Subsection (a)(2)(D); and				
18	(2	as soon as pract	icable, deter	mine whether the	
19	senior citizen's disappearance poses a credible threat to the				
20	senior citizen's health and safety for purposes of Subsection				
21	<u>(a)(3).</u>				
22	Sec. 41	387. ACTIVATION O	F SILVER ALEF	RT. (a) When a	
23	local law enfo	ement agency notifi	es the departm	nent under Section	
24	411.386, the department shall confirm the accuracy of the				
25	information and, if confirmed, immediately issue an alert under				
26	this subchapter in accordance with department rules.				
27	(b) In	ssuing the alert,	the departmen	t shall send the	

- 1 alert to designated media outlets in Texas. Following receipt of
- 2 the alert, participating radio stations, television stations, and
- 3 other media outlets may issue the alert at designated intervals to
- 4 <u>assist in locating the missing senior citizen.</u>
- 5 Sec. 411.388. CONTENT OF SILVER ALERT. The alert must
- 6 include:
- 7 (1) all appropriate information that is provided by
- 8 the local law enforcement agency and that may lead to the safe
- 9 recovery of the missing senior citizen; and
- 10 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 11 <u>information related to the missing senior citizen to contact a</u>
- 12 <u>local law enforcement agency.</u>
- 13 Sec. 411.389. TERMINATION OF SILVER ALERT. (a) The
- 14 director shall terminate any activation of the alert with respect
- to a particular missing senior citizen not later than the earlier of
- 16 the date on which:
- 17 (1) the missing senior citizen is located or the
- 18 situation is otherwise resolved; or
- 19 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by
- 20 department rule.
- 21 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing
- 22 <u>senior citizen who is the subject of an alert under this subchapter</u>
- 23 shall notify the department as soon as possible that the missing
- 24 <u>senior citizen has been located.</u>
- 25 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
