3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 453.301, Occupations Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 453.301. TREATING PATIENT WITHIN SCOPE OF PRACTICE
7	[UNDER PRIOR REFERRAL]. (a) A physical therapist may treat a
8	patient for an injury or condition that is within the physical
9	therapist's scope of practice under Section 453.005 or a board rule
10	[was the subject of a prior referral if the physical therapist:
11	[(1) has been licensed to practice physical therapy
12	for at least one year;
13	[(2) notifies the referring practitioner of the
14	therapy not later than the fifth business day after the date therapy
15	is begun;
16	[(3) begins any episode of treatment before the first
17	anniversary of the referral by the referring practitioner;
18	[(4) for physical therapy episodes subsequent to the
19	episode which was initiated by the referral, treats the patient for
20	not more than 20 treatment sessions or 30 consecutive calendar
21	days, whichever occurs first; and
22	[(5) satisfies any other requirement set by the
23	board].
24	(b) The physical therapist must confer with an appropriate

No. 1321 <u>health care [the referring</u>] practitioner before the physical 1 2 therapist may continue treatment if there is not a significant functional improvement in the patient's condition within a 3 4 reasonable and predictable time [that exceeds treatment authorized under Subsection (a)(4)]. 5 6 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 453.302, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 453.302. EMERGENCY TREATMENT OF [TREATING] PATIENT 8 [WITHOUT REFERRAL]. 9 SECTION 3. Sections 453.302(b) and (c), Occupations Code, 10 are amended to read as follows: 11 In an emergency circumstance, including a 12 (b) minor emergency, a physical therapist may provide, without conferring 13 14 with another health care practitioner, emergency medical care to a 15 person to the best of the therapist's ability to stabilize the person's condition and to prevent or minimize further harm or 16 17 exacerbation of the person's condition [without a referral from a referring practitioner]. 18 (c) A physical therapist providing emergency medical care 19 to a person under Subsection (b) shall confer, as soon as 20 21 practicable, with an appropriate health care practitioner regarding the emergency and refer the person to an appropriate 22 health care [may provide physical assessments or instructions to an 23 24 asymptomatic person without a referral from a referring] 25 practitioner. SECTION 4. Section 453.351(a), Occupations Code, is amended 26 27 to read as follows:

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(a) The board may deny a license or suspend or revoke a
license, place a license holder on probation, reprimand a license
holder, impose an administrative penalty, or otherwise discipline a
license holder if the applicant or license holder has:

5 (1) except as provided by Section [453.301 or] 6 453.302, provided <u>care</u> [physical therapy] to a person <u>outside the</u> 7 <u>scope of the physical therapist's practice</u> [without a referral from 8 <u>a referring practitioner</u>];

9 (2) used drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent 10 that affects the license holder's or applicant's professional 11 competence;

12 (3) been convicted of a felony, including a finding or 13 verdict of guilty, an admission of guilt, or a plea of nolo 14 contendere, in this state or in any other state or nation;

15 (4) obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraud16 or deception;

17 (5) been grossly negligent in the practice of physical18 therapy or in acting as a physical therapist assistant;

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(6) been found to be mentally incompetent by a court;

20 (7) practiced physical therapy in a manner detrimental
21 to the public health and welfare;

(8) had a license to practice physical therapy revoked or suspended or had other disciplinary action taken against the license holder or applicant;

(9) had the license holder's or applicant's application for a license refused, revoked, or suspended by the proper licensing authority of another state or nation; or

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1 (10) in the case of a physical therapist assistant, 2 treated a person other than under the direction of a physical 3 therapist.

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4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
