5	SECTION 1. Subsection (c), Section 1071.253, Occupations
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	(c) The board shall issue a surveyor-in-training
8	certificate to an applicant who passes the applicable parts of the
9	examination taken under Subsection (b). The certificate is valid
10	for eight years [until the earlier of:
11	[(1) the sixth anniversary of the date of issuance; or
12	[(2) the date the certificate holder becomes
13	registered as a registered professional land surveyor].
14	SECTION 2. Section 1071.305, Occupations Code, is amended
15	by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
16	(d) As a condition for retaining a surveyor-in-training
17	certificate, the board shall require the certificate holder to
18	successfully complete continuing professional education courses as
19	prescribed by board rule. The certificate holder shall maintain
20	records relating to the person's professional education
21	activities. The records are subject to audit by the board as a
22	condition for retaining the certificate.
23	SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act by the
24	amendment of Sections 1071.253 and 1071.305, Occupations Code,

apply to a person who holds a surveyor-in-training certificate under Chapter 1071, Occupations Code, on the effective date of this Act or is issued a certificate on or after that date.

4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
