6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 101.055. CERTAIN GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTIONS. This chapter
8	does not apply to a claim arising:
9	(1) in connection with the assessment or collection of
10	taxes by a governmental unit;
11	(2) from the action of an employee while responding to
12	an emergency call or reacting to an emergency situation if the
13	action is in compliance with the laws and ordinances applicable to
14	emergency action, or in the absence of such a law or ordinance, if
15	the action is not taken with conscious indifference or reckless
16	disregard for the safety of others; $[\frac{\partial r}{\partial r}]$
17	(3) from the failure to provide or the method of
18	providing police or fire protection; or
19	(4) from the action of a peace officer, if:
20	(A) the peace officer is a:
21	(i) sheriff or sheriff's deputy; or
22	(ii) municipal police officer;
23	(B) the officer is engaged in the pursuit of a

motor vehicle and the action:

1	(i) is not taken with conscious
2	indifference or reckless disregard for the safety of others; and
3	(ii) is in compliance with the laws and
4	ordinances applicable to the peace officer regarding the pursuit of
5	a motor vehicle; and
6	(C) the action occurs while the peace officer is
7	operating a vehicle appropriately marked as an official police
8	vehicle.
9	SECTION 2. Section 101.055, Civil Practice and Remedies
10	Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a cause of action
11	commenced on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of
12	action commenced before the effective date of this Act is governed
13	by the law that existed immediately before the effective date of
14	this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
15	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
