## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to access to motor vehicle key information.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter K, Chapter 547, Transportation Code,
5	is amended by adding Section 547.616 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 547.616. ACCESS TO MOTOR VEHICLE KEY INFORMATION.
7	(a) In this section:
8	(1) "Information" includes a motor vehicle's key code
9	and, if applicable, immobilizer or access code, and its successor
10	technology and terminology.
11	(2) "Motor vehicle" means a passenger vehicle as
12	defined by Section 541.201.
13	(3) "Registered locksmith" means a locksmith or
14	locksmith company licensed or registered in this state that has
15	also registered with a motor vehicle manufacturer, and been issued
16	a registry number and security password by the manufacturer.
17	(4) "Registered owner" includes a lessee of a motor
18	vehicle when the lessee's name appears on the vehicle registration.
19	(b) This section applies only to new motor vehicles sold or
20	leased in this state on or after September 1, 2008, except as
21	provided by Subsection (k).
22	(c) A motor vehicle manufacturer of a motor vehicle sold or
23	leased in this state shall provide the means whereby the registered

owner of the motor vehicle, through a registered locksmith, can

- 1 access the information, and only that information, that is
- 2 necessary to permit the production of a replacement key or other
- 3 functionally similar device by the registered locksmith that will
- 4 <u>allow the registered owner to enter, start, and operate the</u>
- 5 vehicle. The motor vehicle manufacturer shall provide access to
- 6 this information by telephone or electronically 24 hours a day and
- 7 seven days a week.
- 8 <u>(d) If a registered locksmith is requested by the motor</u>
- 9 <u>vehicle's registered owner to produce a replacement key or other</u>
- 10 <u>functionally similar device that will allow the vehicle to be</u>
- 11 entered, started, and operated, the locksmith must verify the
- 12 identity and obtain the authorization of the owner as required by
- 13 Section 1702.286, Occupations Code, as added by Chapter 1102, Acts
- of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005, before obtaining
- 15 the information needed from the vehicle manufacturer in order to
- 16 produce the requested key or other functionally similar device.
- (e) After producing the replacement key or other
- 18 functionally similar device, the registered locksmith shall give
- 19 any key code information obtained from the motor vehicle
- 20 manufacturer to the registered owner and shall destroy all access
- 21 information provided by the vehicle manufacturer in the locksmith's
- 22 possession.
- 23 (f) Except in cases of fraud or misappropriation, a
- 24 registered locksmith who follows the procedures provided by this
- 25 section does not incur liability for theft of the motor vehicle
- related to the locksmith's production of a replacement key or other
- functionally similar device that allows the vehicle to be entered,

- 1 started, and operated.
- 2 (g) A motor vehicle manufacturer that receives a request
- 3 from a registered locksmith for information to enable the locksmith
- 4 to produce a replacement key or other functionally similar device
- 5 that will allow a motor vehicle to be entered, started, and operated
- 6 shall require the registered locksmith to:
- 7 (1) confirm the locksmith's registration with the
- 8 manufacturer's registry;
- 9 (2) provide the security password issued by the
- 10 manufacturer;
- 11 (3) confirm the locksmith's verification of the
- 12 registered owner as required under Subsection (d);
- 13 (4) the vehicle identification number and model number
- of the motor vehicle; and
- 15 (5) comply with any other reasonable authentication
- 16 procedure.
- 17 (h) A motor vehicle manufacturer shall provide to a
- 18 registered locksmith that has satisfied the requirements of
- 19 Subsection (g) the information necessary to enable the production
- of a replacement key or other functionally similar device that will
- 21 allow the vehicle to be entered, started, and operated.
- (i) A motor vehicle manufacturer subject to this section
- 23 shall retain and make available the information described by this
- 24 section for at least 25 years after the date of manufacture of a
- 25 motor vehicle.
- 26 (j) A motor vehicle manufacturer that follows the
- 27 procedures provided by this section does not incur liability for

- 1 theft of the vehicle related to furnishing the information to a
- 2 registered locksmith for the production of a replacement key or
- 3 other functionally similar device that will allow the vehicle to be
- 4 <u>entered</u>, started, and operated.
- 5 (k) This section does not apply to a make of a motor vehicle
- 6 that sold fewer than 1,000 vehicles in this state in the prior
- 7 <u>calendar year</u>.
- 8 (1) The duties imposed on a motor vehicle manufacturer by
- 9 this section may be performed either by the manufacturer or by an
- 10 agent of the manufacturer acting under a contract.
- 11 (m) The provisions of this section are severable. If any
- 12 provision of this section or its application is held invalid, that
- invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications that
- 14 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
