- 2 relating to certain employment records maintained by the Commission
- 3 on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education; providing an
- 4 administrative penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) Before a law enforcement agency may hire a person
- 10 licensed under this chapter, the agency head or the agency head's
- 11 designee must:
- 12 (1) make a written request to the commission for any
- 13 employment termination report regarding the person that is
- 14 maintained by the commission under this subchapter; and
- 15 (2) submit to the commission on the form prescribed by
- 16 the commission confirmation that the agency:
- 17 (A) conducted in the manner prescribed by the
- 18 <u>commission</u> a criminal background check regarding the person;
- 19 (B) obtained the person's written consent on a
- 20 <u>form prescribed by the commission</u> for the agency to view the
- 21 person's employment records;
- (C) obtained from the commission any service or
- 23 education records regarding the person maintained by the
- 24 commission; and

Τ	(D) contacted each of the person's previous law
2	enforcement employers.
3	(a-1) A law enforcement agency that obtains a consent form
4	described by Subsection (a)(2)(B) shall make the person's
5	employment records available to a hiring law enforcement agency on
6	request.
7	SECTION 2. Section 1701.452, Occupations Code, is amended
8	to read as follows:
9	Sec. 1701.452. EMPLOYMENT TERMINATION REPORT. (a) The
10	head of a law enforcement agency or the head's designee shall submit
11	a report to the commission on a form prescribed by the commission
12	regarding a person licensed under this chapter who resigns or
13	<u>retires</u> from [$\frac{\text{the}}{\text{employment}}$ employment $\frac{\text{with}}{\text{of}}$] the law enforcement agency.
14	[or] whose appointment with the law enforcement agency is
15	terminated, or who separates from the law enforcement agency for
16	any other reason. The agency head or the designee shall include in
17	the report <u>a statement on whether the license holder was honorably</u>
18	discharged, generally discharged, or dishonorably discharged. For
19	<pre>purposes of this subsection:</pre>
20	(1) "Honorably discharged" means:
21	(A) the officer retired in good standing;
22	(B) the officer resigned in good standing to
23	<pre>pursue a non-law enforcement career;</pre>
24	(C) the officer resigned in good standing to
25	<pre>pursue a law enforcement career;</pre>
26	(D) the officer was killed in the line of duty;
27	(E) the officer died while in good standing with

1	the agency;
2	(F) the officer was disabled while in good
3	standing and is unable to perform duties;
4	(G) the position was eliminated while the officer
5	was in good standing;
6	(H) the officer transferred from regular officer
7	status to reserve officer status;
8	(I) the officer transferred from reserve officer
9	status to regular officer status;

- 2 [(E) killed in the line of duty, which applies
- 3 only to an officer who was killed while performing the officer's
- 4 duties as a peace officer in or outside this state;
- 5 [(F) died, which applies only to an officer who
- 6 died for a reason that is not described by Paragraph (E); or
- 7 [(C) disabled, which applies only to an officer
- 8 who was unable to fulfill the officer's duties as a peace officer
- 9 because of an injury or illness].
- 10 (b) The head of the law enforcement agency from which a
- 11 person resigns, retires, [ex] is terminated, or separates for
- 12 reasons other than death, or the head's designee, shall provide to
- 13 the person a copy of the report. If the person who is the subject of
- 14 the employment termination report is deceased, the head of the law
- 15 enforcement agency or the head's designee on request shall provide
- 16 a copy of the report to the person's next of kin.
- 17 (c) The head of a law enforcement agency or the head's
- designee must submit a report under this section each time a person
- 19 licensed under this chapter resigns, retires, [ex] is terminated,
- or separates for any other reason from the agency. The report is an
- 21 official government document.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter J, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 1701.4521 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1701.4521. LICENSE SUSPENSION FOR OFFICER
- 25 <u>DISHONORABLY DISCHARGED</u>. (a) The commission may suspend the
- license of an officer on notification that the officer has been
- 27 dishonorably discharged.

- 1 (b) The commission shall suspend the license of an officer
- 2 on notification that the officer has been dishonorably discharged
- 3 if the officer has previously been dishonorably discharged from
- 4 another law enforcement agency.
- 5 (c) An officer whose license is suspended under this section
- 6 may appeal the suspension in writing to the commission not later
- 7 than the 30th day after the date the officer is suspended.
- 8 (d) After a commission determination, the commission may
- 9 revoke or reinstate the officer's license in accordance with rules
- or procedures adopted by the commission under this chapter related
- 11 to revocation or reinstatement of a license. The commission shall
- 12 revoke the officer's license if the officer does not appeal the
- 13 suspension before the 30th day after the date the officer is
- 14 suspended.
- 15 <u>(e) The commission's decision does not affect:</u>
- 16 <u>(1) the employment relationship between an officer and</u>
- 17 a law enforcement agency; or
- 18 (2) any disciplinary action taken against an officer
- by a law enforcement agency.
- 20 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act in relation
- 21 to employment termination reports apply only to a report under
- 22 Subchapter J, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 23 Act, regarding a resignation or termination that occurs on or after
- 24 the effective date of this Act. An employment termination report
- 25 regarding a resignation or termination that occurs before the
- 26 effective date of this Act is governed by the law as it existed
- 27 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is

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- 1 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 2 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
