4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 54.5395 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.5395. STUDENT ENDOWMENT FUND FEE; TEXAS A&M
8	UNIVERSITYCORPUS CHRISTI. (a) The board of regents of The Texas
9	A&M University System may impose a student endowment fund fee or
10	each student enrolled at Texas A&M UniversityCorpus Christi. The

- 17 <u>(c) The amount of the fee may not be increased by more than</u>
  18 <u>10 percent unless the increase has been approved by a majority vote</u>

  20 general student election called for that purpose.
- 21 <u>(d) A fee imposed under this section must be used to</u> 22 establish a student endowment fund under Section 56.247.
- 23 <u>(e) A fee imposed under this section is in addition to any</u> 24 other fee authorized by law and may not be considered in determining

- 1 the maximum amount of student services fees that may be imposed
- 2 under Section 54.503(b).
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 56.243, Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 56.243. ELECTION TO PARTICIPATE. A [Not later than
- 6 September 1, 2004, a] general academic teaching institution may
- 7 elect to participate in the Student Endowment Scholarship and
- 8 Internship Program. For the institution to make the election, the
- 9 student government of the institution must determine by official
- 10 action that the program would benefit the institution. If the
- 11 student government determines that the program would benefit the
- 12 institution, in a general election called for that purpose a
- 13 majority of the students of the institution voting in the election
- 14 must approve an additional fee and the potential matching grant
- 15 from the state. If the majority approves the additional fee and
- 16 potential matching grant from the state, the governing board of the
- 17 institution shall impose and decide the structure of the additional
- 18 fee.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 56.246, Education Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 56.246. AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP OR INTERNSHIP FUNDING.
- 22 (a) [During the five-year period during which the institution may
- 23 receive state matching funds, the amount of student endowment
- 24 scholarship funding for an internship may not exceed \$500 per
- 25 semester or summer session.
- 26 [<del>(b)</del>] The amount of a student endowment scholarship may not
- 27 exceed the amount of tuition and required fees that a student would

- 1 be charged by the institution.
- 2 (b) [<del>(c)</del>] The amount of student endowment internship
- 3 funding may not exceed the amount of tuition and required fees that
- 4 a student would be charged by the institution during the student's
- 5 period of internship.
- 6 (c) [<del>(d)</del>] On receipt of a scholarship or internship funding
- 7 under this subchapter, a student must comply with any applicable
- 8 conditions of the scholarship or internship funding.
- 9 SECTION 4. Subsections (a) and (c), Section 56.247,
- 10 Education Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) Each institution shall establish a student endowment
- 12 fund consisting of the revenue from the additional student fee[7
- 13 the state matching funds appropriated for the purpose, and the
- 14 interest and other income from investment of the fund. The fund
- 15 shall be invested by the governing board in accordance with the
- 16 policies governing investment of other funds held and invested by
- 17 the board on behalf of the institution.
- 18 (c) Scholarships and internships may be paid from both the
- income and the principal of the fund, except that after the first
- 20 five-year period after the date the fund is established, [during
- 21 which state matching funds are payable, for any year] not more than
- 22 five percent of the principal of the fund may be expended for
- 23 scholarships and internships for any year.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2007 fall
- 25 semester.
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
