- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 54.5395 to read as follows:
- Sec. 54.5395. STUDENT ENDOWMENT FUND FEE; TEXAS A&M

 NUNIVERSITY--CORPUS CHRISTI. (a) The board of regents of The Texas

 A&M University System may impose a student endowment fund fee on

 each student enrolled at Texas A&M University--Corpus Christi. The

 fee may not be imposed unless approved by a majority vote of the

 students participating in a general student election held at the

 university under Section 56.243.
- 14 <u>(b) The amount of the fee may not exceed \$1 per semester for</u>
 15 <u>each regular semester or summer session, unless the amount is</u>
 16 increased as provided by Subsection (c).
- 17 (c) The amount of the fee per semester may be increased from
 18 one academic year to the next only if approved by a majority vote of
 19 the students of the university participating in a general student
 20 election held for that purpose or, if the amount of the increase
 21 does not exceed five percent, by a majority vote of the legislative
 22 body of the student government of the university.
- 23 (d) A fee imposed under this section must be used to establish a student endowment fund under Section 56.247.

- 1 (e) A fee imposed under this section is in addition to any
- 2 other fee authorized by law and may not be considered in determining
- 3 the maximum amount of student services fees that may be imposed
- 4 under Section 54.503(b).
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 56.243, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 56.243. ELECTION TO PARTICIPATE. A [Not later than
- 8 September 1, 2004, a] general academic teaching institution may
- 9 elect to participate in the Student Endowment Scholarship and
- 10 Internship Program. For the institution to make the election, the
- 11 student government of the institution must determine by official
- 12 action that the program would benefit the institution. If the
- 13 student government determines that the program would benefit the
- 14 institution, in a general election called for that purpose a
- 15 majority of the students of the institution voting in the election
- 16 must approve an additional fee and the potential matching grant
- 17 from the state. If the majority approves the additional fee and
- 18 potential matching grant from the state, the governing board of the
- 19 institution shall impose and decide the structure of the additional
- 20 fee.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 56.246, Education Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 56.246. AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP OR INTERNSHIP FUNDING.
- 24 (a) [During the five-year period during which the institution may
- 25 receive state matching funds, the amount of student endowment
- 26 scholarship funding for an internship may not exceed \$500 per
- 27 semester or summer session.

- 1 [(b)] The amount of a student endowment scholarship may not
- 2 exceed the amount of tuition and required fees that a student would
- 3 be charged by the institution.
- 4 (b) [(c)] The amount of student endowment internship funding
- 5 may not exceed the amount of tuition and required fees that a
- 6 student would be charged by the institution during the student's
- 7 period of internship.
- 8 (c) (d) On receipt of a scholarship or internship funding
- 9 under this subchapter, a student must comply with any applicable
- 10 conditions of the scholarship or internship funding.
- 11 SECTION 4. Sections 56.247(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) Each institution shall establish a student endowment
- 14 fund consisting of the revenue from the additional student fee[7
- 15 the state matching funds appropriated for the purpose, and the
- 16 interest and other income from investment of the fund. The fund
- 17 shall be invested by the governing board in accordance with the
- 18 policies governing investment of other funds held and invested by
- 19 the board on behalf of the institution.
- 20 (c) Scholarships and internships may be paid from both the
- 21 income and the principal of the fund, except that after the <u>first</u>
- 22 five-year period after the date the fund is established, [during
- 23 which state matching funds are payable, for any year] not more than
- 24 five percent of the principal of the fund may be expended for
- 25 scholarships and internships for any year.
- 26 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2007 fall
- 27 semester.
