A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to certain duties of the Office of Rural Community Affairs
- 3 relating to assisting, and providing information regarding,
- 4 volunteer fire departments in rural areas.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 487.051, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 487.051. POWERS AND DUTIES. The office shall:
- 9 (1) develop a rural policy for the state in
- 10 consultation with local leaders representing all facets of rural
- 11 community life, academic and industry experts, and state elected
- 12 and appointed officials with interests in rural communities;
- 13 (2) work with other state agencies and officials to
- 14 improve the results and the cost-effectiveness of state programs
- 15 affecting rural communities through coordination of efforts;
- 16 (3) develop programs to improve the leadership
- 17 capacity of rural community leaders;
- 18 (4) monitor developments that have a substantial
- 19 effect on rural Texas communities, especially actions of state
- 20 government, and compile an annual report describing and evaluating
- 21 the condition of rural communities;
- 22 (5) administer the federal community development
- 23 block grant nonentitlement program;
- 24 (6) administer programs supporting rural health care

- 1 as provided by this chapter;
- 2 (7) perform research to determine the most beneficial
- 3 and cost-effective ways to improve the welfare of rural
- 4 communities;
- 5 (8) ensure that the office qualifies as the state's
- 6 office of rural health for the purpose of receiving grants from the
- 7 Office of Rural Health Policy of the United States Department of
- 8 Health and Human Services under 42 U.S.C. Section 254r;
- 9 (9) manage the state's Medicare rural hospital
- 10 flexibility program under 42 U.S.C. Section 1395i-4; [and]
- 11 (10) seek state and federal money available for
- 12 economic development in rural areas for programs under this
- 13 chapter; and
- 14 (11) work with interested persons to assist volunteer
- 15 fire departments and emergency services districts in rural areas.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 487.060, Government Code, as added by
- 17 Chapter 634, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005,
- is amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 487.060. EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT PROGRAM. (a) The
- 20 office shall establish a program to provide interested rural
- 21 communities with:
- 22 (1) general information about emergency services
- 23 districts;
- 24 (2) information and training related to the
- 25 establishment of an emergency services district; and
- 26 (3) technical assistance related to the
- 27 implementation of an emergency services district.

(b) The program may:

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- 2 (1) assist fire departments in rural areas with the 3 recruitment and retention of volunteer firefighters;
- 4 (2) provide to fire departments in rural areas
- 5 information relating to assistance programs offered to rural
- 6 volunteer firefighters, including the federal Staffing for
- 7 Adequate Fire and Emergency Response grant program to help fire
- 8 departments increase staffing and deployment capabilities; and
- 9 (3) provide to rural homeowners information relating
- 10 to the benefits of volunteer fire departments, including a
- 11 reduction in homeowners insurance risk ratings, lower homeowners
- insurance rates, and better fire protection.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
