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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to certain duties of the Office of Rural Community Affairs relating to assisting volunteer fire departments and emergency services districts in rural areas.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 487.051, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 487.051. POWERS AND DUTIES. The office shall:

- (1) develop a rural policy for the state in consultation with local leaders representing all facets of rural community life, academic and industry experts, and state elected and appointed officials with interests in rural communities;
- (2) work with other state agencies and officials to improve the results and the cost-effectiveness of state programs affecting rural communities through coordination of efforts;
- (3) develop programs to improve the leadership capacity of rural community leaders;
- (4) monitor developments that have a substantial effect on rural Texas communities, especially actions of state government, and compile an annual report describing and evaluating the condition of rural communities;
- (5) administer the federal community development block grant nonentitlement program;
- (6) administer programs supporting rural health care as provided by this chapter;
- (7) perform research to determine the most beneficial and cost-effective ways to improve the welfare of rural communities;
- (8) ensure that the office qualifies as the state's office of rural health for the purpose of receiving grants from the Office of Rural Health Policy of the United States Department of Health and Human Services under 42 U.S.C. Section 254r;
- (9) manage the state's Medicare rural hospital flexibility program under 42 U.S.C. Section 1395i-4; [and]
- (10) seek state and federal money available for economic development in rural areas for programs under this chapter; and
- (11) work with interested persons to assist volunteer fire departments and emergency services districts in rural areas.

 SECTION 2. Section 487.060, Government Code, as added by
- SECTION 2. Section 487.060, Government Code, as added by Chapter 634, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 487.060. EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT PROGRAM.

 (a) The office shall establish a program to provide interested rural communities with:
- (1) general information about emergency services districts;
- (2) information and training related to the establishment of an emergency services district; and
- (3) technical assistance related to the implementation of an emergency services district.
- (b) The program may:
 (1) assist fire departments in rural areas with the recruitment and retention of volunteer firefighters;
- 1-61 recruitment and retention of volunteer firefighters;
 1-62 (2) provide to fire departments in rural areas
 1-63 information relating to assistance programs offered to rural
 1-64 volunteer firefighters, including the federal Staffing for

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Adequate Fire and Emergency Response grant program to help fire departments increase staffing and deployment capabilities; and

(3) provide to rural homeowners information relating to the benefits of volunteer fire departments, including a reduction in homeowners insurance risk ratings, lower homeowners insurance rates, and better fire protection.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
