## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to student fees at component institutions of The Texas A&M
3	University System.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 54.5031, Education Code,
6	is amended to read as follows:
7	(a) A student fee advisory committee is established at each
8	institution of higher education except The University of Texas at
9	Austin and the institutions of The Texas A&M University System to
10	advise the governing board and administration of the institution on
11	the type, amount, and expenditure of compulsory fees for student
12	services under Section 54.503 of this code.
13	SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
14	amended by adding Section 54.5032 to read as follows:
15	Sec. 54.5032. STUDENT FEE ADVISORY COMMITTEE; THE TEXAS A&M
16	UNIVERSITY SYSTEM. (a) A student fee advisory committee is
17	established at each component institution of The Texas A&M
18	University System to advise the board of regents and the
19	administration of the institution on the type, amount, and
20	expenditure of compulsory fees for student services under Section
21	54.503, for student health and medical services under Section

24 (b) Each committee is composed of the following nine

recreational sports under Section 54.539.

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54.507, for student center facilities under Section 54.521, and for

1 members: (1) five student members who are enrolled for not less 2 3 than six semester credit hours at the institution and who are representative of all students enrolled at the institution, 4 selected under Subsection (c); and 5 6 (2) four members who are representative of the entire 7 institution, appointed by the president of the institution. 8 (c) If the institution has a student government, the student 9 government shall appoint three students to serve two-year terms on 10 the committee and two students to serve one-year terms on the committee. If the institution does not have a student government, 11 the students enrolled at the institution shall elect three students 12 13 to serve two-year terms on the committee and two students to serve one-year terms on the committee. A candidate for a position on the 14 15 committee must designate whether the position is for a one-year or 16 two-year term. 17 (c-1) This subsection expires September 1, 2009. 18 Notwithstanding Subsection (c): (1) a person serving on the student fee advisory 19 20 committee under Section 54.5031 at an institution to which this section applies on the date this section takes effect is considered 21 22 to be a member of the student fee advisory committee established at 23 the institution under this section for the same term that the person is serving when this section takes effect; and 24 25 (2) a person appointed, elected, or otherwise selected to serve on the student fee advisory committee under Section 26 27 54.5031 at an institution to which this section applies before the

1	date this section takes effect for a term that was to begin on or
2	after the date this section takes effect is considered to have been
3	appointed, elected, or otherwise selected to serve on the student
4	fee advisory committee established at the institution under this
5	section for the same term.
6	(d) A student member of the committee who withdraws from the
7	institution must resign from the committee.
8	(e) A vacancy in an appointive position on the committee
9	shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in the same
10	manner as the original appointment. A vacancy in an elective
11	position on the committee shall be filled for the unexpired portion
12	of the term by appointment by the president of the institution.
13	(f) The committee shall:
14	(1) study the type, amount, and expenditure of the
15	compulsory fees imposed under Sections 54.503, 54.507, 54.521, and
16	54.539; and
17	(2) meet with appropriate administrators of the
18	institution, submit a written report on the study under Subdivision
19	(1), and recommend the type, amount, and expenditure of the
20	compulsory fees to be charged for the next academic year.
21	(g) Before recommending the student fee budget to the board
22	of regents each year, the president of the institution shall
23	consider the report and recommendations of the committee. If the
24	president's recommendations to the board of regents are
25	substantially different from the committee's recommendations to
26	the president, the president of the institution shall notify the
27	committee not later than the last date on which the committee may

request an appearance at the meeting of the board of regents at which the student fee budget will be considered. On request of a member of the committee, the president of the institution shall provide the member with a written report of the president's recommendations to the board of regents.

6 SECTION 3. Subsections (a), (c), (d), and (e), Section 7 54.539, Education Code, are amended to read as follows:

If approved by student vote at an institution, the Board 8 (a) 9 of Regents of The Texas A&M University System may charge students at 10 a component institution of [such institutions within] The Texas A&M University System a recreational sports fee not to exceed \$175 for 11 each regular [\$100 a] semester and not to exceed \$87.50 for each 12 term of each [or 12-week] summer session [or \$50 a six-week summer 13 session]. The fee may be used only for financing, constructing, 14 15 operating, maintaining, and improving new and existing recreational sports facilities and programs at the designated 16 institution [university]. 17

The amount of the fee authorized by this section may not 18 (c) be increased to an amount that exceeds by 10 percent or more the 19 20 total amount of the fee that is in effect on September 1, 2007, or as last approved by a student vote under this subsection [from one 21 22 academic year to the next] unless the increase has been approved by a majority vote of the students at the affected institution 23 participating in a general election called for that purpose [ $\tau$ 24 25 except that at Tarleton State University the fee may be increased by not more than 10 percent from one academic year to the next without 26 27 holding an election]. The fee may not exceed the maximum amounts

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provided by Subsection (a).

If, in an academic year, the total compulsory fee 2 (d) 3 charged under this section is proposed to be increased by an amount less than an amount that would require a student election under 4 Subsection (c), the board of regents of The Texas A&M University 5 System may, in lieu of an election, hold a public meeting on the 6 7 increase at which students have the opportunity to comment before the increase takes effect [A fee may not be imposed under this 8 9 section until the semester in which a campus recreational sports 10 facility will be available for use].

(e) Each university shall collect any student recreational 11 sports fee imposed under this section and shall deposit the money 12 collected in an account to be known as the student recreational 13 [A recreational sports fee may not be collected 14 sports account. after the 20th anniversary of the date it is first collected or 15 16 after all bonded indebtedness for any campus recreational sports 17 facility for which the fee receipts are pledged is paid, whichever is later.] 18

19 SECTION 4. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is 20 amended by adding Sections 54.5395, 54.5396, and 54.5397 to read as 21 follows:

22 <u>Sec. 54.5395. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS FEES; TEXAS A&M</u>
23 <u>INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY. (a) The board of regents of The Texas</u>
24 <u>A&M University System may impose an intercollegiate athletics fee</u>
25 <u>on each student enrolled at Texas A&M International University.</u>
26 <u>The fee may not be imposed unless approved by a majority vote of the</u>
27 <u>students participating in a general student election held at the</u>

1	university for that purpose.
2	(b) The amount of the fee may not exceed \$5 per semester
3	credit hour for each regular semester or summer session, unless the
4	amount is increased as provided by Subsection (c).
5	(c) The amount of the fee may not be increased to an amount
6	that exceeds by 10 percent or more the total amount of the fee as
7	last approved by a student vote under Subsection (a) or this
8	subsection unless the increase has been approved by a majority vote
9	of the students enrolled at the university who participate in a
10	general student election held for that purpose.
11	(d) A student enrolled in more than 15 semester credit hours
12	shall pay the fee in an amount equal to the amount imposed on a
13	student enrolled in 15 semester credit hours during the same
14	semester or session.
15	(e) A fee imposed under this section may be used to develop
16	and maintain an intercollegiate athletics program at the
17	<u>university.</u>
18	(f) A fee imposed under this section is in addition to any
19	other fee authorized by law and may not be considered in determining
20	the amount of student services fees that may be imposed under
21	<u>Section 54.503.</u>
22	Sec. 54.5396. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS FEES; WEST TEXAS
23	A&M UNIVERSITY. (a) The board of regents of The Texas A&M
24	<u>University System may impose an intercollegiate athletics fee on</u>
25	each student enrolled at West Texas A&M University. The fee may not
26	be imposed unless approved by a majority vote of the students
27	participating in a general student election held at the university

1	for that purpose.
2	(b) The amount of the fee may not exceed \$10 per semester
3	credit hour for each regular semester or summer session, unless the
4	amount is increased as provided by Subsection (c).
5	(c) The amount of the fee may not be increased to an amount
6	that exceeds by 10 percent or more the total amount of the fee as
7	last approved by a student vote under Subsection (a) or this
8	subsection unless the increase has been approved by a majority vote
9	of the students enrolled at the university who participate in a
10	general student election held for that purpose.
11	(d) A student enrolled in more than 13 semester credit hours
12	shall pay the fee in an amount equal to the amount imposed on a
13	student enrolled in 13 semester credit hours during the same
14	semester or session.
15	(e) A fee imposed under this section may be used to develop
16	and maintain an intercollegiate athletics program at the
17	<u>university.</u>
18	(f) A fee imposed under this section is in addition to any
19	other fee authorized by law and may not be considered in determining
20	the amount of student services fees that may be imposed under
21	<u>Section 54.503.</u>
22	Sec. 54.5397. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS FEES; TEXAS A&M
23	UNIVERSITYCOMMERCE. (a) The board of regents of The Texas A&M
24	University System may impose an intercollegiate athletics fee on
25	each student enrolled at Texas A&M UniversityCommerce. The fee
26	may not be imposed unless approved by a majority vote of the
27	students participating in a general student election held at the

1	university for that purpose.
2	(b) The amount of the fee may not exceed \$10 per semester
3	credit hour for each regular semester or summer session, unless the
4	amount is increased as provided by Subsection (c).
5	(c) The amount of the fee may not be increased to an amount
6	that exceeds by 10 percent or more the total amount of the fee as
7	last approved by a student vote under Subsection (a) or this
8	subsection unless the increase has been approved by a majority vote
9	of the students enrolled at the university who participate in a
10	general student election held for that purpose.
11	(d) A student enrolled in more than 13 semester credit hours
12	shall pay the fee in an amount equal to the amount imposed on a
13	student enrolled in 13 semester credit hours during the same
14	semester or session.
15	(e) A fee imposed under this section may be used to develop
16	and maintain an intercollegiate athletics program at the
17	<u>university.</u>
18	(f) A fee imposed under this section is in addition to any
19	other fee authorized by law and may not be considered in determining
20	the amount of student services fees that may be imposed under
21	<u>Section 54.503.</u>
22	SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies
23	beginning with a fee imposed for the 2007 fall semester. A fee
24	imposed for an academic period before the 2007 fall semester is
25	covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
26	of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
27	purpose.

1 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
