- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 56.462, Education Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:
- Sec. 56.462. LOAN FORGIVENESS. (a) A student who receives
 a Texas B-On-time loan shall be forgiven the amount of the student's
 loan if the student is awarded an undergraduate certificate or
 degree at an eligible institution with a cumulative grade point

average of at least 3.0 on a four-point scale or the equivalent:

- 25 institution or eligible institution that offers only junior-level
- 26 <u>and senior-level undergraduate courses with a cumulative grade</u>

- 1 equivalent within five calendar years after the date the student

- 4 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 56.462, Education Code,
- 5 as added by this Act, applies only to a student who is awarded an
- 6 undergraduate degree on or after the effective date of this Act,
- 7 without regard to when the student is awarded a Texas B-On-time
- 8 loan.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
