## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the removal of a trustee.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 113.082, Property Code, is amended by
5	adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
6	(d) A trustee shall be removed if the grantor and each
7	beneficiary agrees to the removal and provides the trustee with a
8	written notice of removal signed by the grantor and each
9	beneficiary. On receipt of a notice under this subsection, the
10	trustee may resign or petition a court for discharge. A trustee
11	that petitions a court for discharge under this section is entitled
12	to the trustee's reasonable attorney's fees incurred in the
13	proceeding.
14	(e) For the purposes of Subsection (d):
15	(1) the term "beneficiary" means a person currently
16	receiving or currently entitled to receive distributions from the
17	trust estate and does not include contingent, unborn, or
18	unascertained beneficiaries; and
19	(2) the following persons may act on behalf of a minor
20	or otherwise incapacitated beneficiary:
21	(A) the guardian of the minor or otherwise
22	incapacitated beneficiary;
23	(B) if there is no guardian, the parent of the
24	beneficiary, if the parent does not have a conflict of interest; or

- 2 <u>Subdivision (1) or (2), any other beneficiary of the trust acting</u>
- 3 under the doctrine of virtual representation as set forth in
- 4 <u>Section 115.013(c)(4).</u>
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
