- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Act is to enhance
- 6 the protection and preservation of irreplaceable formations in
- 7 caves and to increase the deterrent effect of penalties for
- 8 violations of Chapter 201, Natural Resources Code.

Texas; providing penalties.

- 9 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Sections 201.011, 201.014, and
- 10 201.041, Natural Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 201.011. PERMIT REQUIRED. No person may excavate,
- 12 remove, destroy, injure, alter in any significant manner, or deface
- any part of a cave owned by the State of Texas, unless the person
- 14 <u>possesses a valid</u> [he first obtains a] permit under Section 201.012
- 15 [of this code].

- Sec. 201.014. PENALTIES. [(a)] A person who violates
- 17 Section 201.011 [of this code] is guilty of a Class A [B]
- 18 misdemeanor, unless the person has previously been convicted of
- 19 violating Section 201.011, in which case the person is guilty of a
- 20 state jail felony.
- 21 [(b) A person who violates Section 201.012 of this code is
- 22 guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and the permit shall be revoked.
- Sec. 201.041. VANDALISM. (a) A person may not, without
- 24 express, prior, written permission of the owner, [wilfully or]

- 1 knowingly:
- 2 (1) break, break off, crack, carve upon, write, burn,
- 3 or otherwise mark upon, remove, or in any manner destroy,
- 4 [disturb,] deface, mar, or harm the surfaces of any cave or any
- 5 natural material in a cave, including speleothems;
- 6 (2) <u>deface, mar, or harm</u> [<u>disturb or alter</u>] in any
- 7 manner the natural condition of any cave; or
- 8 (3) break, force, tamper with, or otherwise disturb a
- 9 lock, gate, door, or other obstruction designed to control or
- 10 prevent access to any cave, even though entrance to the cave may not
- 11 be gained.
- 12 (b) A person who violates a provision of this section is
- 13 guilty of a state jail felony [Class A misdemeanor], unless the
- 14 <u>person</u> [he] has previously been convicted of violating this
- 15 section, in which case the person [he] is guilty of a felony of the
- 16 third degree.
- 17 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection (b), Section 201.042,
- 18 Natural Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a Class A
- 20 [B] misdemeanor, unless the person has previously been convicted of
- 21 violating this section, in which case the person is guilty of a
- 22 <u>state jail felony</u>.
- SECTION 4. SAVING PROVISION. (a) The change in law made by
- 24 this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the
- 25 effective date of this Act. For purposes of this section, an
- 26 offense is committed before the effective date of this Act if any
- 27 element of the offense occurs before that date.

- 1 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 2 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 3 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 5 1, 2007.
