- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 2171.101(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 5
- The office of vehicle fleet management shall establish a 6 vehicle reporting system to assist each state agency that manages a
- vehicle fleet in the management of its vehicle fleet. A state 8
- agency shall be required to submit the reports on a quarterly basis, 9
- not earlier than the 45th day or later than the 60th day after the 10
- 11 date on which the quarter ends.
- 12 SECTION 2. Sections 2171.104(b) and (c), Government Code,
- 13 are amended to read as follows:
- The Texas Department of Transportation, Department of 14
- Public Safety of the State of Texas, Health and Human Services 15
- <u>Commission</u> [<del>Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental</del> 16
- Retardation], Parks and Wildlife Department, and Texas Department 17
- of Criminal Justice shall assist the office of vehicle fleet 18
- management in preparing the management plan for the state's vehicle 19
- fleet. 20

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- 21 The management plan must address:
- 22 [opportunities for consolidating and privatizing]
- the operation and management of  $\underline{\text{the consolidated}}$  vehicle fleets 23
- managed by the commission and the Health and Human Services 24

- 1 Commission [in areas where there is a concentration of state
- 2 agencies, including the Capitol Complex and the Health and Human
- 3 Services Complex in Austin];
- 4 (2) the number and type of vehicles owned by each
- 5 agency that manages a vehicle fleet and the purpose each vehicle
- 6 serves;
- 7 (3) procedures to increase vehicle use and improve the
- 8 efficiency of the state vehicle fleet;
- 9 (4) procedures to reduce the cost of maintaining state
- 10 vehicles;
- 11 (5) procedures to handle surplus or salvage state
- 12 vehicles; and
- 13 (6) lower-cost alternatives to using state-owned
- 14 vehicles, including:
- 15 (A) using rental cars; and
- 16 (B) reimbursing employees for using personal
- 17 vehicles.
- SECTION 3. Section 2171.1045, Government Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- Sec. 2171.1045. RESTRICTIONS ON ASSIGNMENT OF VEHICLES.
- 21 Each state agency shall adopt rules, consistent with the management
- 22 plan adopted under Section 2171.104, relating to the assignment and
- use of state [the agency's] vehicles. The rules must require that:
- 24 (1) each state [agency] vehicle, with the exception of
- 25 a vehicle assigned to a field employee, be assigned to the
- 26 appropriate agency motor pool and be available for checkout; and
- 27 (2) an agency may assign a vehicle to an individual

- 1 administrative or executive employee on a regular or everyday basis
- 2 only if the agency makes a written documented finding that the
- 3 assignment is critical to the needs and mission of the agency.
- 4 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 2171, Government Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 2171.106 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 2171.106. CONSOLIDATED FLEET OPERATIONS. (a) This
- 7 section does not apply to an institution of higher education as
- 8 defined by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 9 (b) Only the following six state agencies may manage a
- 10 vehicle fleet:
- 11 (1) Texas Department of Transportation;
- 12 (2) Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas;
- 13 (3) Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
- 14 (4) Parks and Wildlife Department;
- 15 (5) Health and Human Services Commission; and
- 16 (6) the commission.
- 17 (c) The Health and Human Services Commission shall make
- vehicles available for use by health and human services agencies.
- 19 The commission shall make vehicles available for use by each state
- 20 agency except a health and human services agency or an agency listed
- 21 <u>in Subsections (b)(1)-(5).</u>
- 22 (d) The Health and Human Services Commission and the
- 23 <u>commission shall charge other state agencies a per-mile fee for the</u>
- 24 use of a vehicle under Subsection (c) to recover the direct and
- 25 indirect costs of owning and operating the vehicle, including the
- 26 cost of fuel, maintenance, and fleet administration.
- 27 (e) The Health and Human Services Commission and the

- 4 SECTION 5. (a) Before December 1, 2007, the Health and Human

- 9 Services;
- 10 (2) Department of Family and Protective Services;
- 11 (3) Department of Aging and Disability Services; and
- 12 (4) Department of State Health Services.
- (b) On the date established by the plan in Subsection (a) of
- 14 this section, a state agency shall transfer ownership, possession,
- 15 and control of its vehicles to the Health and Human Services

- 17 SECTION 6. (a) Before December 1, 2007, the Texas Building
- 18 and Procurement Commission shall establish a transition plan with
- 19 each of the following agencies to phase in on a quarterly basis the
- 20 transfer of vehicles owned by each agency to the Texas Building and
- 21 Procurement Commission:
- 22 (1) Adjutant General's Department;

- 25 (4) Department of Information Resources;
