S.B. No. 1534

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the development of a regional water supply reservoir
- 3 project at a site known as Cedar Ridge in Haskell, Shackelford, and
- 4 Throckmorton Counties, Texas.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, Cedar Ridge Reservoir
- 7 Project means the reservoir project on the Clear Fork Brazos River
- 8 Haskell, Shackelford and Throckmorton Counties, Texas, that is
- 9 identified for development in the current state and regional water
- 10 plans.
- 11 SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The legislature finds
- 12 that:
- 13 (1) the development of new water supplies to meet the
- 14 growing demand for water is necessary for the sound economic
- 15 development of this state and is of concern and importance to this
- 16 state;
- 17 (2) the state water plan identifies several sites for
- 18 new reservoirs as having unique value for reservoir construction,
- including the site for the Cedar Ridge Reservoir; and
- 20 (3) the designation of the site for the Cedar Ridge
- 21 Reservoir Project as a unique reservoir site is necessary for the
- 22 sound economic development of this state and for the purpose of
- 23 promoting the public health, safety, and general welfare of this
- 24 state.

1 SECTION 3. DESIGNATION OF SITE. The legislature, as authorized by Section 16.051(g), Water Code, designates the site 2 known as the Cedar Ridge Reservoir on the Clear Fork Brazos River in 3 Haskell, Shackelford, and Throckmorton Counties, Texas, as a site 4 of unique value for the construction of a dam and reservoir. 5 legislature also determines that the Cedar Ridge Reservoir Project 6 7 is necessary to meet identified water supply requirements in Region G of the state water plan. 8

9 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 10 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 11 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article 4 III, 12 Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary 13 for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
