## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2  | relating to the issuance of bonds by a municipality for a defined    |
| 3  | area in an abolished municipal utility district.                     |
| 4  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:              |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 43, Local Government Code,          |
| 6  | is amended by adding Section 43.0805 to read as follows:             |
| 7  | Sec. 43.0805. MUNICIPAL BONDS USED TO CARRY OUT PURPOSES OF          |
| 8  | DEFINED AREA IN ABOLISHED MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT. (a) This       |
| 9  | section applies only to a municipality that under any other law,     |
| 10 | including Section 43.075, abolishes a municipal utility district     |
| 11 | created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, that      |
| 12 | contains a defined area that the district created under Subchapter   |
| 13 | J, Chapter 54, Water Code.   |
| 14 | (b) If, before its abolition, the district voted to issue            |
| 15 | bonds for the defined area under Section 54.806, Water Code, and if  |
| 16 | some or all of the bonds were not issued, sold, and delivered before |
| 17 | the abolition, the governing body of the municipality may issue and  |
| 18 | sell municipal bonds in an amount not to exceed the amount of the    |
| 19 | unissued district bonds to carry out the purposes for which the      |
| 20 | district bonds were voted.   |
| 21 | (c) The bonds must be authorized by ordinance of the                 |
| 22 | governing body of the municipality. The ordinance must provide for   |
| 23 | the levy of taxes on all taxable property in the defined area of the |
| 24 | abolished district to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds |

- 1 when due. The bonds must be sold at not less than par value and
- 2 accrued interest, and must mature, bear interest, and be subject to
- 3 approval by the attorney general and to registration by the
- 4 comptroller as provided by law for other general obligation bonds
- 5 of the municipality.
- 6 (d) A bond that is approved, registered, and sold as
  7 provided by this section is incontestable.
- 8 (e) This section repeals a municipal charter provision to
- 9 the extent of a conflict with this section. This section does not
- 10 affect the authority of a municipality to issue bonds for other
- 11 purposes.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 43.0805, Local Government Code, as added
- 13 by this Act, applies to a municipal utility district abolished, or a
- 14 district vote to issue bonds that occurred, before, on, or after the
- 15 effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
