A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT	

- 2 relating to allowing qualified organizations to conduct raffles
- 3 using stored value cards and video displays.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2002.054, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (d) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) The organization may not:
- 9 (1) directly or indirectly, by the use of paid
- 10 advertising, promote a raffle through a medium of mass
- 11 communication, including television, radio, or newspaper, except:
- 12 (A) in an area that consists of all or part of not
- 13 more than two metropolitan statistical areas as identified by the
- 14 United States Census Bureau; or
- 15 (B) in an area that includes any part of more than
- 16 20 counties if the area does not include a metropolitan statistical
- 17 area;

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- (2) promote or advertise a raffle statewide; or
- 19 (3) sell or offer to sell tickets for a raffle
- 20 statewide.
- 21 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (d) and Section
- 22 2002.060, the [The] organization may not compensate a person
- 23 directly or indirectly for organizing or conducting a raffle or for
- 24 selling or offering to sell tickets to a raffle.

- 1 (d) A qualified organization that conducts a raffle at a
- 2 bingo premises may pay to each licensed authorized organization
- 3 conducting bingo at the bingo premises a rental fee for the use of
- 4 the premises, which may be equal to a percentage of the proceeds of
- 5 the raffle.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 2002.056(d), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (d) A raffle is not authorized by this chapter unless the
- 9 organization:
- 10 (1) has the prize to be offered in the raffle in its
- 11 possession or ownership; [or]
- 12 (2) posts bond with the county clerk of the county in
- which the raffle is to be held for the full amount of the money value
- of the prize; or
- 15 (3) demonstrates in a written document made available
- 16 to each person who participates in the raffle that the organization
- or its agent has on deposit with a financial institution in this
- 18 state an amount equal to at least 50 percent of the outstanding
- 19 value of raffle prizes offered at any time by the organization.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 2002, Occupations Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Sections 2002.060 and 2002.061 to read as
- 22 follows:
- Sec. 2002.060. STORED VALUE CARDS. (a) A qualified
- 24 organization may conduct a raffle using stored value cards to
- 25 account for the cost of tickets purchased by a participant and the
- 26 value of prizes awarded to the participant.
- 27 (b) A stored value card used in a raffle must:

1	(1) serve as evidence of a promise made by the
2	qualified organization that issued the card that the organization
3	will provide to the card owner goods or services with a value equal
4	to the amount of value stored on the card;
5	(2) be prefunded and allow for the redemption of the
6	amount of value stored on the card;
7	(3) be issued in the name of the card owner;
8	(4) not be capable of being exchanged for money;
9	(5) be capable of tracking the owner's usage of the
10	card;
11	(6) be issued by a financial institution, as defined
12	in Section 201.101, Finance Code; and
13	(7) be issued and activated at the location where the
14	raffle prize will be awarded.
15	(c) A financial institution is liable for the amount of
16	value stored on each stored value card used in conducting a raffle.
17	(d) A qualified organization may not issue a stored value
18	card to a person unless the person:
19	(1) presents a valid government-issued identification
20	card or document that is immediately verified under applicable
21	federal law by the organization; and
22	(2) complies with all state and federal laws governing
23	the issuance of the card.
24	(e) A qualified organization may pay ordinary and necessary
25	consideration to a person that provides raffle services requiring
26	the purchase or use of stored value cards for the equipment
27	necessary to utilize stored value cards in conducting a raffle.

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1 Sec. 2002.061. VIDEO DISPLAY. A qualified organization may 2 conduct a raffle using a video display to represent the purchase of 3 a ticket by a participant and the award of a prize to a participant. 4 A raffle conducted using a video display may be held only at a bingo premises, as defined by Section 2001.002(22), during one or more 5 6 bingo occasions at those premises. SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007. 11
