A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to reports of performance data of private or independent
3	institutions of higher education and the publication of that data.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.0903 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.0903. PUBLICATION OF PERFORMANCE DATA OF PRIVATE OR
8	INDEPENDENT INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) The board shall
9	administer a program to publish performance data provided to the
10	board under this section by private or independent institutions of
11	higher education that admit entering freshman and offer one or more
12	baccalaureate degrees.
13	(b) Not later than the next January 1 following the
14	completion of an academic year, each private or independent
15	institution of higher education shall provide to the board one or
16	more reports containing data related to:
17	(1) the qualifications of the entering freshman class
18	for the academic year covered by the report, including:
19	(A) to the extent available, the average scores
20	of the class on each generally recognized test or assessment used in
21	college and university undergraduate admissions, including the
22	Scholastic Assessment Test and the ACT assessment;
23	(B) to the extent available, the range of scores
24	of the class from the 25th to the 75th percentile on each generally

1	recognized test or assessment used in college and university
2	undergraduate admissions, including the Scholastic Assessment Test
3	and the ACT assessment;
4	(C) the overall grade point average of the class
5	for the academic year covered by the report;
6	(D) the number of students in the class who
7	graduated in the top 10 percent of the student's high school
8	graduating class; and
9	(E) enrollment percentages by ethnicity; and
10	(2) student performance and institution efficiency,
11	including:
12	(A) the retention rate of full-time students
13	after the completion of one academic year at the institution;
14	(B) the percentage of full-time degree-seeking
15	undergraduate students who earn a baccalaureate degree before the
16	sixth anniversary of the date of the student's first enrollment at
17	the institution;
18	(C) if the institution has a tenure system, the
19	percentage of faculty members who are tenured or tenure-track
20	faculty;
21	(D) the average number of students in an
22	undergraduate class;
23	(E) the student-to-faculty ratio for
24	undergraduate students;
25	(F) the percentage of students receiving
26	financial aid;
27	(G) the average cost of tuition and fees for an

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1	undergraduate student who, as determined by the board, is enrolled
2	full-time;
3	(H) the average cost of on-campus room and board
4	for an academic year, excluding summer sessions;
5	(I) the number of disciplines in which master's
6	degrees are offered, if any;
7	(J) the number of disciplines in which doctoral
8	degrees are offered, if any;
9	(K) a description of any departments, schools, or
10	certificate or degree programs of the institution that have a
11	statewide or national reputation for excellence; and
12	(L) statistics regarding job placement rates for
13	students awarded certificates or degrees by the institution.
14	(c) Each year the board shall publish and post in a grid
15	format on the board's Internet site the names of the private or
16	independent institutions of higher education, the performance data
17	required by Subsection (b) for the most recent academic year for
18	which the data is available, and any other information considered
19	appropriate by the board.
20	(d) A private or independent institution of higher
21	education is not required to report to the board the data required
22	by Subsection (b) if the data is available to the board from another
23	source.
24	SECTION 2. (a) Each private or independent institution of
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higher education shall provide the performance data as required by Section 61.0903, Education Code, as added by this Act, beginning with the data for the 2008-2009 academic year.

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1 (b) Not later than March 1, 2010, the Texas Higher Education 2 Coordinating Board shall publish and post on the board's Internet 3 site the performance data provided by the private or independent 4 institutions of higher education in this state as required by 5 Section 61.0903, Education Code, as added by this Act.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
