## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to reports of performance data of private or independent
- 3 institutions of higher education and to the publication of that
- 4 data.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 61.0902, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 61.0902. PUBLICATION OF PERFORMANCE DATA OF GENERAL
- 9 ACADEMIC TEACHING INSTITUTIONS AND PRIVATE OR INDEPENDENT
- 10 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) The board shall administer a
- 11 program to publish performance data provided to the board under
- 12 this section by general academic teaching institutions and by
- 13 private or independent institutions of higher education that offer
- one or more baccalaureate degrees [under this section].
- 15 (b) Not later than the next November 1 following the
- 16 completion of an academic year, each [general academic teaching]
- institution described by Subsection (a) shall provide to the board
- one or more reports containing data related to:
- 19 (1) the qualifications of the entering freshman class
- 20 for the academic year covered by the report, including:
- 21 (A) the average [<del>Texas Academic Skills Program</del>
- 22 Test] scores of the class on an assessment instrument designated
- 23 under Section 51.3062;
- 24 (B) the average scores of the class on each

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- 1 generally recognized test or assessment used in college and
- 2 university undergraduate admissions, including the Scholastic
- 3 Assessment Test (SAT) and the American College Test (ACT);
- 4 (C) the range of scores of the class from the 25th
- 5 to the 75th percentile on each generally recognized test or
- 6 assessment used in college and university undergraduate
- 7 admissions, including the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) and the
- 8 American College Test (ACT);
- 9 (D) the overall grade point average of the class
- 10 for the academic year covered by the report;
- 11 (E) the number of students in the class who
- 12 graduated in the top 10 percent of the student's high school
- 13 graduating class; and
- 14 (F) enrollment percentages by ethnicity; and
- 15 (2) student performance and institution efficiency,
- 16 including:
- 17 (A) the retention rate of full-time students
- 18 after the completion of one academic year at the institution;
- 19 (B) the percentage of full-time degree-seeking
- 20 undergraduate students who earn a baccalaureate degree before the
- 21 sixth anniversary of the date of the student's first enrollment at
- 22 the institution;
- 23 (C) the percentage of lower-division semester
- 24 credit hours taught by tenured or tenure-track faculty;
- 25 (D) the percentage of undergraduate classes with
- 26 fewer than 20 students;
- 27 (E) the percentage of undergraduate classes with

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- 1 more than 50 students;
- 2 (F) the student-to-faculty ratio for
- 3 undergraduate students;
- 4 (G) the percentage of students receiving
- 5 financial aid;
- 6 (H) the average cost of tuition and fees for an
- 7 undergraduate student enrolled for 12 semester credit hours;
- 8 (I) the average cost of on-campus room and board
- 9 for an academic year, excluding summer sessions;
- 10 (J) the number of disciplines in which master's
- 11 degrees are offered;
- 12 (K) the number of disciplines in which doctoral
- 13 degrees are offered;
- 14 (L) a description of any departments, schools, or
- 15 certificate or degree programs of the institution that have a
- 16 statewide or national reputation for excellence; and
- 17 (M) statistics regarding job placement rates for
- 18 students awarded certificates or degrees by the institution.
- 19 (c) Each year the board shall publish and post in a grid
- 20 format on the board's Internet site the names of the [general
- 21 academic teaching institutions described by Subsection (a), the
- 22 performance data required by Subsection (b) for the most recent
- 23 academic year for which the data is available, and any other
- 24 information considered appropriate by the board. The board shall
- use the classification system developed by the Carnegie Foundation
- in publishing and posting the data and other information.
- 27 (d) Each [general academic teaching] institution described

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- 1 by Subsection (a) shall provide a link on the institution's
- 2 Internet home page to the board's Internet site described by
- 3 Subsection (c).
- 4 (e) An [A general academic teaching] institution described
- 5 by Subsection (a) is not required to report to the board the data
- 6 required by Subsection (b) if the data is available to the board
- 7 from another source.
- 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to the
- 9 reporting and publication of the performance data of private or
- 10 independent institutions of higher education under Section
- 11 61.0902, Education Code, as amended by this Act, beginning with the
- data required to be reported not later than November 1, 2008.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
