5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 52.01, Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 52.01. ADMINISTRATION. The Texas Higher Education
9	Coordinating Board, or its successors, shall administer the student
10	loan program authorized by this chapter pursuant to [Article III,]
11	Sections [50b, 50b-1, 50b-2, 50b-3,] 50b-4, [and] 50b-5 <u>, and 50b-6,</u>
12	Article III, [of the] Texas Constitution, and any former provision
13	of the Texas Constitution authorizing bonds to finance educational
14	loans to students. Personnel and other expenses required to
15	properly administer this chapter shall be funded by:
16	(1) the general appropriations acts; or
17	(2) any other source of revenue received by the board
18	in connection with the operation of the student loan program.
19	SECTION 2. Subdivision (4), Section 52.501, Education Code,
20	is amended to read as follows:
21	(4) "Bond" means a general obligation bond issued by
22	the board under [Article III,] Section [50b, 50b-1, 50b-2, 50b-3,]
23	50b-4, [or] 50b-5 <u>, or 50b-6, Article III,</u> [of the] Texas
24	Constitution, or any former provision of the Texas Constitution

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authorizing bonds to finance educational loans to students. 1 2 SECTION 3. Subdivision (2), Section 52.81, Education Code, 3 is amended to read as follows: 4 (2) "Bond" means a general obligation bond issued by the board under former [Article III,] Section 50b-3[,] or Section 5 50b-4, [or] 50b-5, or 50b-6, Article III, [of the] Texas 6 7 Constitution. Subsection (a), Section 52.82, Education Code, SECTION 4. 8 9 is amended to read as follows: The board may by resolution authorize the issuance of 10 (a) 11 general obligation bonds in total aggregate amounts not to exceed: \$300 million under former Section 50b-3, Article 12 (1) 13 III, Texas Constitution; \$300 million under Section 50b-4, Article III, 14 (2) 15 Texas Constitution; [and] 16 (3) \$400 million under Section 50b-5, Article III, Texas Constitution; and 17 (4) \$500 million under Section 50b-6, Article III, 18 19 Texas Constitution. SECTION 5. Section 52.87, Education Code, is amended to 20 read as follows: 21 Sec. 52.87. MANDAMUS. The performance of official duties 22 prescribed by this subchapter and by former Section [Article III, 23 Sections] 50b-3[7] and Sections 50b-4, [and] 50b-5, and 50b-6, 24 25 Article III, [of the] Texas Constitution, in reference to the payment of the bonds, may be enforced in a court of competent 26 27 jurisdiction by mandamus or other appropriate proceedings.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect on the date on which the 2 constitutional amendment proposed by the 80th Legislature, Regular 3 Session, 2007, providing for the issuance of \$500 million in 4 general obligation bonds to finance educational loans to students 5 and authorizing bond enhancement agreements with respect to general 6 obligation bonds issued for that purpose takes effect. If that 7 amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act has no effect.
